ENROLLED, An Act,

To amend Section 12-15-114, Code of Alabama 1975; to provide that the juvenile court shall have exclusive original jurisdiction over termination of parental rights proceedings; to express the intent of the Legislature regarding jurisdiction of the juvenile court in termination of parental rights cases; and to provide for retroactivity to January 1, 2009.

10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. Section 12-15-114, Code of Alabama 1975, is amended to read as follows:

13 "§12-15-114.

14 "(a) A juvenile court shall exercise exclusive 15 original jurisdiction of juvenile court proceedings in which a 16 child is alleged to have committed a delinquent act, to be 17 dependent, or to be in need of supervision. A dependency 18 action shall not include a custody dispute between parents. 19 Juvenile cases before the juvenile court shall be initiated through the juvenile court intake office pursuant to this 20 21 chapter.

"(b) A juvenile court shall not have jurisdiction
over any delinquent act committed by an individual before his
or her 18th birthday for which a petition has not been filed
before the individual reaches 21 years of age, except when the

delinquent act is an offense having no statute of limitation
 as provided in Section 15-3-5.

3 "(c) A juvenile court shall also exercise exclusive 4 original jurisdiction of proceedings arising out of the above 5 juvenile court proceedings, including, but not limited to, 6 <u>over</u> each of the following:

7 "(1) Proceedings pursuant to the Interstate Compact
8 on Juveniles and the Interstate Compact on Placement of
9 Children pursuant to Chapter 2 of Title 44.

10 "(2) Proceedings for termination of parental rights, 11 as this term is defined in subdivision (10) of Section 12 12-15-301."

13 Section 2. The Legislature finds that its original 14 intent in the adoption of Act 2008-277, the Alabama Juvenile 15 Justice Act, was for a juvenile court to exercise exclusive 16 original jurisdiction in all termination of parental rights proceedings. The amendatory language to Section 12-15-114, 17 Code of Alabama 1975, provided in Section 1, is intended to be 18 19 curative and shall apply retroactively for the purpose of ratifying and confirming the exercise of original jurisdiction 20 21 of the juvenile court to hear and adjudicate termination of 22 parental rights cases filed in juvenile court on and after January 1, 2009, and prior to the effective date of this act. 23 24 Any order of a juvenile court issued while exercising 25 jurisdiction pursuant to this section during that time shall

be deemed valid in absence of an adjudication on appeal to the contrary.

3 Section 3. The provisions of this act are severable.
4 If any part of this act is declared invalid or
5 unconstitutional, that declaration shall not affect the part
6 which remains.

Section 4. This act shall become effective
immediately following its passage and approval by the
Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
