Section 1. (a) Any person who is totally disabled and who has been a bona fide resident of the state for not less than six months next preceding the date of application, upon the payment of an issuance fee of one dollar (\$1), may procure a special disabled person's hunting license in the following manner: The applicant shall file, in the county in which he or she resides, with the person who is duly authorized to issue licenses, an application stating his or her age, place of residence, post office address, and length of residence in this state. The application shall have attached a sworn statement by a licensed physician or chiropractor of this state stating that the applicant is totally disabled.

- (b) The hunting licenses issued pursuant to this section shall be valid on a continuous basis during the period of total disability. Notwithstanding the foregoing, any conservation enforcement officer, upon reasonable belief that the license holder is no longer totally disabled, may request the holder to obtain a recertification of disability, which request shall be in writing. Upon the failure of the holder to furnish the recertification of disability within 90 days of receipt of request, the holder's license shall be void and shall be confiscated by the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources, Game and Fish Division.
- (c) The issuing officer or authority shall be allowed an issuance fee of one dollar (\$1) for each license issued. In counties in which the judge of probate or issuing

officer is on a fee system, the issuing fee shall be retained
by the judge of probate or issuing officer, and in a county in
which the judge of probate is on a salary basis, the issuing
fee shall be paid into the county treasury. These licenses
shall not be issued by special agents. The name of the
physician certifying to the disability of the licensee shall

(d) The licenses issued pursuant to this section shall be in lieu of the annual resident hunting licenses provided in Section 9-11-44, Code of Alabama 1975, but shall not supplant any additional license or requirement to hunt on a state-operated wildlife management area, as provided in Section 9-11-45, Code of Alabama 1975, or to hunt migratory waterfowl in this state, as provided in Section 9-11-433, Code of Alabama 1975.
