25	current vaccine recommendations of the Centers for Disease
26	Control and Prevention for parents of newborn infants. The
27	educational information shall be regularly updated and made

available on the department's website in a form that can be

printed and provided to a parent of a newborn infant. During

the postpartum period, before discharging a newborn child, a

hospital shall provide the infant's parent with educational

information developed by the department and made available on

its website.

- (b) Nothing in this section shall be construed to require any hospital to provide or pay for any vaccination against pertussis.
- (c) Nothing in this section shall be construed to establish a standard of care for hospitals or physicians or otherwise modify, amend, or supersede any provision of the Alabama Medical Liability Act of 1987 or the Alabama Medical Liability Act of 1996, or any amendment thereto, or any judicial interpretation thereof.
- (d) Physicians and hospitals, as hospitals are defined in Section 22-21-20, Code of Alabama 1975, shall be immune from all civil and criminal liability for any claims directly associated with information produced by the Department of Public Health and disseminated pursuant to this act.

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the sixth month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
