8 SYNOPSIS: Under existing law, the Security Regulatory
9 Board regulates contract security companies that
10 employ security officers or armed security
11 officers. In 2013, the Legislature deleted
12 exemptions for a contract security company that
13 employs less than 100 officers and for an employees
14 of the company.

15 This bill would restore the exemptions.

21 To amend Section 34-27C-17 of the Code of Alabama
22 1975, as amended by Act 2013-349, relating to the Security
23 Regulatory Board; to restore the exemptions for contract
24 security companies and employees of the companies under
25 certain conditions.

26 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

1 Section 1. Section 34-27C-17 of the Code of Alabama
2 1975, as amended by Act 2013-349, is amended to read as
3 follows:

4 "§34-27C-17.

5 "The following persons and entities, including
6 affiliated entities under common control, are exempt from this
7 chapter:

8 "(1) Any person or entity which uses the employees
9 of the person or entity for security services.

10 "(2) Any employee who provides security services
11 only for his or her employer and not for any third party.

12 "(3) A sworn peace officer who only provides
13 security services within the scope of his or her employment
14 with a public entity and who does not contract for or
15 otherwise provide in any manner private contract security
16 services.

17 "(4) Any person who is employed with a contract
18 security company which employs, or has an employer-employee
19 relationship with, collectively less than 100 security
20 officers or armed security officers, or both.

21 "(5) A contract security company which employes, or
22 has an employer-employee relationship with, collectively less
23 than 100 security officers or armed security officers, or
24 both."

25 Section 2. This act shall become effective
26 immediately following its passage and approval by the
27 Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
