Section 1. Section 34-27C-17 of the Code of Alabama 1 1975, as amended by Act 2013-349, is amended to read as 2 3 follows: "\$34-27C-17. 4 "The following persons and entities, including 5 6 affiliated entities under common control, are exempt from this 7 chapter: "(1) Any person or entity which uses the employees 8 of the person or entity for security services. 9 10 "(2) Any employee who provides security services only for his or her employer and not for any third party. 11 12 "(3) A sworn peace officer who only provides 13 security services within the scope of his or her employment with a public entity and who does not contract for or 14 15 otherwise provide in any manner private contract security 16 services. 17 "(4) Any person who is employed with a contract security company which employs, or has an employer-employee 18 relationship with, collectively less than 100 security 19 officers or armed security officers, or both. 20 21 "(5) A contract security company which employes, or 22 has an employer-employee relationship with, collectively less 23 than 100 security officers or armed security officers, or 24 both." Section 2. This act shall become effective 25 26 immediately following its passage and approval by the 27 Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
