BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. Section 36-25-15, Code of Alabama 1975,
is amended to read as follows:

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"§36-25-15.

"(a) Candidates at every level of government shall 10 file a completed statement of economic interests for the 11 12 previous calendar year with the appropriate election official 13 State Ethics Commission simultaneously with the date he or she 14 becomes a candidate as defined in Section 17-22A-2 or the date 15 such candidate files his or her qualifying papers with the appropriate election official, whichever date occurs first. 16 17 Such election official shall within five days forward the statement of economic interests of the candidate to the 18 19 commission or when the person complies with the requirements of Section 17-9-3 in the case of an independent candidate. 20 21 Nothing in this section shall be deemed to require a second filing of the person's statement of economic interests if a 22 23 current statement of economic interests is on file with the 24 commission.

"(b) Each election official who receives a
declaration of candidacy or petition to appear on the ballot
for election from a candidate and each official who nominates

a person to serve as a public official shall, within five days of the receipt or nomination, notify the commission of the name of the candidate, as defined in this chapter, and the date on which the person became a candidate or was nominated as a public official.

"(c) Other provisions of the law notwithstanding, if 6 7 a candidate does not submit a statement of economic interests in accordance with the requirements of this chapter, the name 8 9 of the person shall not appear on the ballot and the candidate shall be deemed not qualified as a candidate in that election. 10 Notwithstanding the foregoing, the commission may, for good 11 12 cause shown, allow the candidate an additional five days to 13 file such statement of economic interests. If a candidate is 14 deemed not qualified, the appropriate election official shall 15 remove the name of the candidate from the ballot."

16 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the 17 first day of the third month following its passage and 18 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.

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
