19	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
20	Section 1. Sections 1 and 3 of Act 98-646 of the
21	1998 Regular Session (Acts 1998, p. 1423), are amended to read
22	as follows:
23	"Section 1. In Mobile County, the judge of probate
24	<pre>may impose a special recording fee of two dollars (\$2) not to</pre>
25	exceed five dollars ( $\$5$ ) shall to be collected by the judge of
26	probate on each real or personal property, uniform commercial
27	code, judicial, or other instrument recorded or filed for

record in the probate court of the county. The special recording fee shall be in addition to all other fees, taxes, and other charges required by law to be paid upon the recording or filing for record of any real or personal property, uniform commercial code, judicial, or other instrument. All special recording fees collected shall be deposited by the judge of probate in any depository in the county as designated by the county governing body.

"Section 3. (a) The judge of probate may retain all or parts of court records for archival purposes utilizing optical disks, or other any acceptable computerized methods method for records storage, or any combination thereof. The use of microfilm to retain and archive court records in the county may be discontinued and replaced with digitized or scanned images of records committed to optic disks, or the like any computerized method for records storage. Records archived and retained on optic disks, or the like, any computerized method for records storage shall constitute official records of the court and may be compiled and certified and sold to the public in accordance with applicable statutes. All funds collected for copies and certifications shall be paid to the county general fund.

"(b) Any increase in the special recording fee imposed by the judge of probate over the amount of two dollars (\$2) per instrument shall expire ten (10) years from the effective date of the act adding this subsection."

Section 2. All laws or parts of laws which conflict
with this act are repealed.

Section 3. This act shall become effective

immediately following its passage and approval by the

Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
