8	SYNOPSIS:	Under existing law, it is not specifically
9		illegal to allow a person under the age of 21 to
10		ride in the bed of a pickup truck.
11		This bill would specifically prohibit the
12		operator of a pickup truck from allowing a person
13		age 21 or under to ride in the bed of the pickup
14		truck on a paved highway. The bill would prescribe
15		a penalty for a violation. The bill would provide
16		for a phased in implementation.
17		Amendment 621 of the Constitution of Alabama
18		of 1901, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the
19		Official Recompilation of the Constitution of
20		Alabama of 1901, as amended, prohibits a general
21		law whose purpose or effect would be to require a
22		new or increased expenditure of local funds from
23		becoming effective with regard to a local
24		governmental entity without enactment by a 2/3 vote
25		unless: it comes within one of a number of
26		specified exceptions; it is approved by the

affected entity; or the Legislature appropriates

funds, or provides a local source of revenue, to
the entity for the purpose.

The purpose or effect of this bill would be to require a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of the amendment. However, the bill does not require approval of a local governmental entity or enactment by a 2/3 vote to become effective because it comes within one of the specified exceptions contained in the amendment.

TO BE ENTITLED

13 AN ACT

Prohibiting the operator of a pickup truck from allowing a person of a certain age to ride in the bed of the pickup truck on a paved highway; providing certain exceptions; prescribing a penalty for a violation of this act; providing for a phased in implementation of this act; and in connection therewith would have as its purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of Amendment 621 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. (a) The operator of a pickup truck may
not allow any person age 21 or younger to ride as a passenger
in the bed of the pickup truck on any paved highway in this
state.

- (b) Subsection (a) shall not apply to the operator of a pickup truck while being used in a parade; while being used for farming purposes; or while being used in an emergency situation, if the person age 21 or younger is accompanied within the bed of the truck by an adult.
- (c) Any operator violating this section shall be fined up to fifty dollars (\$50). A violation of this section shall not constitute probable cause for search of the vehicle involved.

Section 2. Although this bill would have as its purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of local funds, the bill is excluded from further requirements and application under Amendment 621, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, because the bill defines a new crime or amends the definition of an existing crime.

Section 3. All laws or parts of laws which conflict with this act are repealed.

Section 4. The period from the effective date of this act until 12 months thereafter shall be a warning period during which any person who violates this act shall be issued a verbal warning or warning citation by a law enforcement

officer, but no monetary fine shall be assessed against the offender. At the conclusion of the warning period, this act shall be in full force and effect.

Section 5. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
