13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
14	Section 1. Section 16-22-1, Code of Alabama 1975, as
15	amended by Act 2013-191, 2013 Regular Session, is amended to
16	read as follows:
17	"\$16-22-1.
18	"(a) The president or chief executive officer of any
19	state college or university, the president or chief executive
20	officer of the Alabama Institute for Deaf and Blind, the
21	Presidents of Talladega College, Concordia College, Samford
22	University, Birmingham-Southern College, Miles College,
23	Stillman College, Tuskegee University, Spring Hill College,
24	and Selma University may appoint and employ one or more
25	suitable persons to act as police officers to keep off
26	intruders and prevent trespass upon and damage to the property
27	of the college or university or of the institute. These

persons shall be charged with all the duties and invested with all the powers of police officers. Any police officer appointed by the President of Miles College shall be restricted to the campus and property of Miles College.

"(b) Any person appointed to act as a police 5 6 officer, pursuant to subsection (a), while on duty, shall 7 carry and be trained in the proper use of a nonlethal weapon. For the purposes of this subsection, a nonlethal weapon is a 8 weapon that is explicitly designed and primarily employed to 9 10 immediately incapacitate the targeted person while minimizing fatalities and permanent injury. A nonlethal weapon is 11 12 intended to have a reversible effect on the targeted person.

"(c) Any report of a crime of violence, as defined 13 in Section 13A-11-70, classified as a hate crime, as described 14 in Section 13A-5-13, or any sex offense as set out in Article 15 4, Chapter 6, Title 13A, reported to have occurred on the 16 17 campus or property of a college, university, or institute that is received by any person appointed to act as a police officer 18 pursuant to subsection (a) of this section or any other 19 college or university law enforcement personnel shall be 20 21 reported to the students and employees within 48 hours of the 22 report unless the release of the information would jeopardize an ongoing criminal investigation or may affect the safety of 23 an individual or cause a suspect to flee or evade detection, 24 or may result in the destruction of evidence. In any of the 25 foregoing cases, the information may be withheld until the 26 27 reason for withholding the report is no longer applicable. The

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report may not disclose the identity or address of the victim 1 or include specific facts that could identify the victim. 2 "(c)(d) This section is cumulative." 3 Section 2. The president of each college or 4 technical school which is under the control of the Board of 5 Education of the State of Alabama shall report a crime б 7 pursuant to the provisions of subsection (c) of Section 16-22-1 of the Code of Alabama 1975, that occurs on the campus 8 or properties of the institution. 9 10 Section 3. This act shall become effective on the 11 first day of the third month following its passage and

approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.

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
