Section 1. (a) Notwithstanding any provision of

Title 17, Code of Alabama 1975, to the contrary, a person may

register to vote electronically pursuant to the provisions of
this section.

- (b) The Secretary of State shall ensure that all of the following services are available to the public at any time on the official website of the Secretary of State:
- (1) Online applications for voter registration, the content of which shall be equivalent to the form provided in Section 17-3-52, Code of Alabama 1975, for use by boards of registrars.
- (2) Online assistance to those applying to register to vote electronically.
- (3) Online completion and submission by applicants of voter registration applications, including the electronic signature of the applicant pursuant to subsection (d).
- (4) Online receipt of completed voter registration applications.
- (c) An application submitted under this section shall be deemed submitted on the date the completed application is sent electronically to the Secretary of State.
- (d) An applicant for voter registration may provide an electronic signature by executing a computerized mark in the signature field as instructed on the online application. The Secretary of State shall determine by rule a method for an applicant to submit an electronic copy of his or her handwritten signature through electronic means. After the

Secretary of State has adopted the rule, an applicant for voter registration shall submit his or her handwritten signature in the manner prescribed by rule.

- (e) Upon submission of a completed voter registration application, the official website of the Secretary of State shall generate an immediate electronic confirmation on the website, in printable form, that the application has been received with instructions as to how the applicant may check the status of the application thereafter.
- (f) The Secretary of State shall accept an online voter registration application submitted under this section and ensure that the individual is registered to vote if the following criteria are met:
- (1) The individual meets the same voter registration eligibility requirements applicable to individuals who register to vote by mail.
- (2) The individual provides an electronic signature in accordance with subsection (d).
- (g) The Secretary of State or a local board of registrars shall inform the applicant of the disposition of his or her application by regular mail and, at the option of the applicant, by e-mail.
- (h) No legal distinction shall be made between registration under this section and in-person, mail, or other registration method allowed under Title 17, Code of Alabama 1975.

Section 2. (a) The Secretary of State shall ensure that any legally registered voter may at any time update his or her registration information, including his or her address, online through the official website of the Secretary of State. Any change in voter registration information shall be deemed submitted on the date the updated information is sent electronically to the Secretary of State. The Secretary of State or appropriate board of registrars shall immediately revise any information on the computerized list to reflect any updated information, including a change in voting precinct when appropriate.

- (b) Upon submission of updated registration information as provided in subsection (a), the official website of the Secretary of State shall generate an immediate electronic confirmation on the website, in printable form, that the change in registration information has been received with instructions as to how the voter may check the status of the change in registration information, including a change in voting precinct when appropriate.
- (c) The Secretary of State or a local board of registrars shall inform the voter of the disposition of his or her change in voter registration information by regular mail and, at the option of the applicant, by e-mail.

Section 3. The Secretary of State shall establish by rule appropriate technological security measures, such as the use of a unique identifier for each registrant, to prevent unauthorized persons from altering an applicant's or

registered voter's information and to ensure the accuracy and integrity of voter registration applications submitted electronically pursuant to Sections 1 and 2 of this act.

Section 4. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
