26	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALARAMA.

Section 1. Section 34-3-7 of the Code of Alabama 2 1975, is amended to read as follows:

3 "\$34-3-7.

"(a) Any person, firm, or corporation who is not a regularly licensed attorney who does an act defined in this article to be an act of practicing law is guilty of a misdemeanor and, on conviction, must shall be punished as provided by law. Any person, firm, or corporation who conspires with, aids, and abets another person, firm, or corporation in the commission of such the misdemeanor must, on conviction, shall be punished as provided by law.

"(b) Notwithstanding any provisions of law, a person who is the sole shareholder of a corporation, sole owner of a business entity, or a member of a limited liability company with five or less members may appear in a court of law on behalf that entity without violating the provisions of this article. A person who appears before a court of law in accordance with this subsection shall be held to the same standards of conduct and subject to all of the rules of court applicable to the proceeding as if he or she were a regularly licensed attorney."

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
