156052-1:n:12/17/2013:JMH/th LRS2013-4418 1 2 3 4 5 6 7 SYNOPSIS: Under existing law, persons engaging in 8 professional work or services pertaining to 9 10 entomological work, including structural pest 11 control, pathological work, horticultural and 12 floricultural work, and tree surgery work as 13 defined in Section 2-28-1, Code of Alabama 1975, are regulated by the Commissioner of Agriculture 14 15 and Industries. 16 This bill would add landscape irrigation 17 work and require that it be regulated by the 18 Commissioner of Agriculture and Industries. 19 This bill would require a landscape 20 irrigation contractor to obtain a permit and 21 prohibit him or her from supervising more than one 22 office. This bill would also add definitions related 23 24 to landscape irrigation and pest control and would 25 provide that applicants for examination for a 26 permit to engage in structural pest control work who have been convicted of certain felonies are not 27

3	This bill would exclude persons engaging in
4	the custom application of pesticides from these

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11	To amend Sections 2-28-1, 2-28-2, 2-28-3, 2-28-4,
12	2-28-5, 2-28-7, and 2-28-12, Code of Alabama 1975, to require
13	that landscape irrigation work be examined by the Commissioner
14	of Agriculture and Industries; to require a landscape
15	irrigation contractor to obtain a permit and to provide
16	supervisory restrictions; to provide prohibition for
17	structural pest control permit applicants; and to exclude
18	persons engaging in the custom application of pesticides from
19	the requirements.
20	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
21	Section 1. Sections 2-28-1, 2-28-2, 2-28-3, 2-28-4,
22	2-28-5, 2-28-7, and 2-28-12, Code of Alabama 1975, are amended
23	to read as follows:
24	"§2-28-1.
25	"When used in this chapter, the following terms
26	shall have the following meanings, respectively, unless the
27	context clearly indicates otherwise:

1 "(6)(1) BRANCH OFFICE. A place of business at an
2 established location other than the main office having
3 equipment and three or more employees directly engaged in
4 structural pest control work from the place of business, which
5 is a subdivision or branch of the main office, point of
6 headquarters, or principal operation of the firm.

7 "(9)(2) BRANCH SUPERVISOR. A person who has been
8 certified by the commissioner as qualified to supervise the
9 operation of a branch office only. In no event shall the
10 person be qualified to supervise structural pest control work
11 from a main office.

12 "(15)(3) BUSINESS LOCATION. Any location in or from 13 which professional work or services are solicited, accepted, 14 or conducted, and identified as a main office, branch office, 15 or suboffice by permit.

16 "(13)(4) CERTIFICATION. The recognition by the 17 commissioner that a person is competent and thus authorized to 18 perform and/or supervise professional work or services in the 19 category or categories listed on said certification permit.

20 "(14)(5) CERTIFICATION PERMIT. A document issued by 21 the commissioner attesting that all standards have been met in 22 competency in one or more categories and/or subcategories of 23 professional work or services.

24 "(8)(6) CERTIFIED OPERATOR. A person who has been
 25 certified by the commissioner as qualified to supervise the
 26 operation of a main office or a branch office.

"(10)(7) COMMISSIONER. The Commissioner of
 Agriculture and Industries.

3 "(11)(8) DEPARTMENT. The Department of Agriculture
4 and Industries.

"(9) EMPLOYEE. A person who is employed by a 5 permittee who provides that person with necessary training, 6 7 supervision, pesticides, equipment, and insurance and who receives compensation from and is under the personal 8 supervision and direct control of the permittee's certified 9 10 operator or supervisor, or both, in charge and from whose 11 compensation the permittee regularly deducts federal income 12 and Social Security taxes.

"(1) (10) ENTOMOLOGICAL WORK. Receiving fees for
advice or prescriptions for the control or eradication of any
insect pest or rodent or for actual spraying, dusting,
fumigating, or any other methods used for the control or
eradication of any insect pest or rodent.

18 "(3) (11) HORTICULTURAL AND FLORICULTURAL WORK.
19 Receiving fees for landscaping and setting of plants, or for
20 the sale of any plants for which the seller contracts to
21 render future services.

"(12) LANDSCAPE IRRIGATION CONTRACTOR. A person
 certified by the commissioner to perform landscape irrigation
 work as defined in this chapter.

25 "(13) LANDSCAPE IRRIGATION WORK. Work for which
 26 compensation or other consideration is received for the

<u>design</u>, construction, repair, maintenance, improvement, or
 <u>alteration of any portion of a landscape irrigation system.</u>

3 "(2)(14) PATHOLOGICAL WORK. Receiving fees for
4 advice or prescriptions for the control or eradication of any
5 plant disease, for actual spraying, or any other methods used
6 for the control or eradication of any plant disease.

7 "(15) REGISTERED EMPLOYEE. A person registered with the department by a permittee who is employed to perform, 8 sell, solicit, or estimate work or services defined in this 9 10 chapter and has not been certified by the commissioner to apply pesticides. In no event shall the person be allowed to 11 12 perform, sell, solicit, or estimate the application of pesticides unless under the direct, on-site supervision of a 13 14 certified operator, branch supervisor, or registered technician qualified for the same type of pesticide 15 16 application.

17 "(16) REGISTERED TECHNICIAN. A person certified by the commissioner through examination or completion of the 18 registered technician training program, or both, or an 19 approved equivalent training program in one or more categories 20 21 or subcategories, or both, of professional work or services 22 which involves the application of pesticides. In no event 23 shall the person be qualified to supervise the operation of a 24 main office or a branch office.

25 "(5)(17) STRUCTURAL PEST CONTROL WORK. That branch 26 or type of entomological, pest control, or eradication work 27 which involves the performance of work or giving advice or 1 prescriptions for compensation for the prevention, control, or 2 eradication of insects, vermin, rodents, pest animals, fungi, or other wood destroying organisms in household structures, 3 4 commercial buildings, or other structures by the use of insecticides, rodenticides, repellants, chemicals, mechanical 5 devices, or structural modifications, as well as a fumigation 6 7 of products, containers, structures, or transportation vehicles. 8

"(7)(18) SUBOFFICE. A place at an established 9 10 location other than the main office or branch office having 11 equipment and less than three employees directly engaged in 12 structural pest control work from the location, which shall not be more than 100 road miles from the branch office or main 13 14 office of the firm. It is not required that any employee of a 15 suboffice be certified by the commissioner for the structural 16 pest control work performed from the office.

17 "(4)(19) TREE SURGERY WORK. Receiving fees for tree 18 surgery, including but not limited to, cavity filling or 19 repair, bracing, cabling, and wound treatment of shrubs and 20 trees. Tree surgery work shall not include pruning, feeding, 21 budding, or grafting of trees, shrubs, or wounds made and 22 treated during pruning.

23 "(12)(20) WEED CONTROL WORK. Receiving fees for 24 advice or prescription for the control or eradication of any 25 weed or for actual spraying or other methods used for the 26 control and eradication of any plant which grows where not 27 wanted.

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"§2-28-2.

Persons engaging in professional work or services pertaining to entomological work, pathological work, horticultural and floricultural work, <u>landscape irrigation</u> <u>work</u>, and tree surgery work as defined in Section 2-28-1 shall be examined by the commissioner.

"§2-28-3.

8 "The commissioner with the approval of the State 9 Board of Agriculture and Industries may adopt and promulgate 10 rules and regulations that are reasonable and necessary to 11 carry out the intent and purpose of this chapter and to 12 regulate persons engaged in professional services or work 13 defined in this chapter to prevent fraudulent and unauthorized 14 practices of those professional services or work.

15 In order to ensure that persons issued a permit or certified under this chapter are capable of performing a high 16 17 quality of workmanship and continue to meet the requirements of a changing technology and assure a continued level of 18 competence and ability, the commissioner with the approval of 19 the State Board of Agriculture and Industries, is hereby 20 21 authorized and empowered to make rules and regulations with 22 respect to:

"1. The qualifications and residency requirements of
an applicant for certification and a permit to engage in any
one or more phases of professional work or service.

"2. The type, frequency, and passing score of any
 examination given an applicant for certification and a permit
 under this chapter.

4 "3. The methods and materials to be used in
5 performing any work authorized by issuance of a permit and
6 certification under this chapter.

7 "4. Records to be made and maintained by persons
8 issued a permit and persons certified under this chapter
9 necessary for the commissioner to determine whether such
10 persons are performing a high quality of workmanship.

11 "5. Methods and procedures necessary and reasonable 12 to protect the interests, health, safety, and welfare of the 13 public and persons engaging in professional work or services 14 where such work or services involve the use of pesticides 15 defined in this chapter.

16 "6. The amount, kind, and frequency of training 17 required of any employee of persons issued a permit or 18 certification where such <u>for</u> professional work or services 19 <u>involves the application of pesticides</u> <u>defined in this</u> 20 chapter.

21 "7. Any other matter deemed necessary to be22 regulated.

23 "§2-28-4.

"(a) Permits generally; fees; delinquent penalty;
subcategories of structural pest control permits and fees.
Before any person engages in professional work or services as
defined in this chapter or before any person may solicit

1 professional work or services through advertising or in any 2 other manner, the person shall apply for and obtain from the commissioner an annual permit on forms furnished for this 3 4 purpose accompanied with the annual permit fee which shall be established by the Board of Agriculture and Industries not to 5 exceed \$200. Structural pest control work as defined in 6 7 subdivision (5) of Section 2-28-1 shall be divided in the following subcategories: (1) Control of wood-destroying 8 9 organisms by any method other than fumigation, (2) Control of 10 industrial, institutional, and household pests by any method other than fumigation, (3) Fumigation pest control. The annual 11 12 permit fee for persons engaged in the type of entomological 13 work known as structural pest control work as defined in 14 subdivision (5) of Section 2-28-1 shall be established by the 15 board for each subcategory of work a person is qualified to 16 perform. Any person engaged in structural pest control work 17 who conducts the work from more than one location or place of business that is a branch office as defined in subdivision (6) 18 of Section 2-28-1 shall be required to obtain a branch office 19 permit for each branch office, and the permit fee shall be 20 21 established by the board for each branch office and for each 22 subcategory of work a person is qualified to perform. If a 23 person conducts structural pest control work from an 24 additional location designated as a suboffice as defined in 25 subdivision (7) of Section 2-28-1, the person shall be required to obtain a suboffice permit for each suboffice, and 26 27 the permit fee shall be established by the board for each

suboffice and for each subcategory of work a person is 1 2 qualified to perform. A person qualified as a landscape irrigation contractor shall be required to obtain a permit for 3 4 landscape irrigation work and shall not supervise more than one office. All permits shall expire on September 30 and shall 5 6 be renewed by October 1 upon payment of the annual permit fee 7 prescribed by this subsection and upon compliance with the other requirements of this chapter. If the permit fee is not 8 paid by November 1 or within 31 days from the date on which 9 10 the fee is due, a delinquent penalty established by the board 11 shall be added to the amount.

12 "(b) Number of permits required. When a person has 13 qualified for a permit to perform more than one type or branch 14 of professional work or services, other than structural pest 15 control work and landscape irrigation work, only one permit shall be required to be obtained by the person, and the permit 16 17 shall specify each type of professional work or service that the person is authorized to perform. When a person has 18 qualified for a permit to perform more than one type or branch 19 of structural pest control work or landscape irrigation work, 20 21 the person shall be required to obtain only one permit, that 22 shall specify each type of work that the person is authorized 23 to perform. Any person who performs structural pest control 24 work from a branch office as defined in this section shall 25 also be required to obtain a branch office permit for each branch office. Any person who performs structural pest control 26

work from a suboffice as defined in this section shall also be
 required to obtain a suboffice permit for each suboffice.

"(c) Statements of applicants as to training and 3 4 experience; testing and examination; issuance of permits; disposition of fees. The commissioner, pursuant to rules and 5 6 regulations promulgated pursuant to this chapter, may require 7 applicants for a permit to submit statements as to training and experience in professional work or services, and 8 9 applicants shall be required to pass any test or examination 10 for each type of professional service or work as the 11 commissioner may prescribe. An examination fee established by 12 the board shall accompany each application for each 13 examination taken by the applicant. All permit fees and examination fees collected under this section shall be 14 15 deposited in the State Treasury to the credit of the Agricultural Fund for the administration and enforcement of 16 17 this chapter. Before a permit is issued to any applicant, the applicant shall be certified by the commissioner as qualified 18 to perform the type of professional work or services for which 19 a permit is desired. A full-time employee of an applicant who 20 21 has been certified by the commissioner as qualified to perform the type or branch of professional work or service in which 22 23 the applicant desires to engage may be designated by the applicant as a supervisor to be in charge of and responsible 24 for the applicant's professional work or services, and the 25 26 permit may be issued designating the employee as a supervisor. "§2-28-5. 27

"(a) Every applicant for examination for a permit to 1 2 engage in structural pest control work, including those who will be designated as certified operators or branch 3 4 supervisors as provided for in Section 2-28-8, shall have a knowledge of the practical and scientific facts underlying the 5 practice of structural pest control work and the necessary 6 7 knowledge and ability to recognize and control those hazardous conditions which may affect human life and health. Applicants 8 for certified operators' or branch supervisors' permits, 9 10 before being eligible to take an examination for structural pest control work, shall present satisfactory evidence to the 11 12 commissioner relative to his or her gualifications.

13 "(b) No applicant for examination for a permit to engage in structural pest control work who has been convicted 14 15 of any felony under state or federal law involving robbery, bribery, extortion, embezzlement, grand larceny, burglary, 16 17 arson, murder, rape, assault with intent to kill, assault that inflicts grievous bodily injury, kidnapping, prostitution, 18 child abuse, child pornography, sexual assault, or indecent 19 exposure shall be eligible to take an examination unless the 20 21 applicant's civil rights have been restored.

"(b)(c) Before a permit is issued to any applicant, the applicant shall be certified by the commissioner as qualified to perform the type or branch of professional work or service for which a permit is desired. Any full-time employee of the applicant who has been certified by the commissioner as qualified to perform the type or branch of professional work or service in which the applicant will engage may be designated by the applicant as a certified operator or branch supervisor to be in charge of and responsible for the applicant's professional work or service, and the permit may be issued naming that employee as certified operator or branch supervisor.

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"§2-28-7.

"Upon determination by the commissioner that any 8 person certified or having a permit issued under the 9 10 provisions of this chapter or any person who has applied for 11 such certification or a permit has violated or failed to 12 comply with any of the provisions or requirements of this 13 chapter or any rules and regulations promulgated thereunder, the commissioner shall be authorized to revoke such 14 15 certification or permit, or both, or he shall refuse to issue a certification or a permit, or both, to an applicant 16 therefor. The performance of unauthorized work not covered by 17 a permit, making misrepresentations or any fraudulent 18 practices, failure to perform a contract, failure to have in 19 its employ, when required, a certified operator or branch 20 21 supervisor or use or continued use of ineffective methods or 22 materials shall also be valid grounds for revocation of a 23 certification or a permit; provided, however, that no 24 certification or permit shall be revoked unless the holder 25 thereof shall be given at least 10 days' notice that such 26 action is to be considered by the commissioner with an 27 opportunity being given for a hearing before the commissioner.

1 "Any applicant refused or denied a certification or 2 permit, or both, or any person whose certification or permit, or both, are revoked shall be entitled to appeal such action 3 4 of the commissioner to the State Board of Agriculture and Industries by filing with the commissioner within a period of 5 15 days a written notice or demand for review of the action of 6 7 the commissioner in denying or revoking a certification or permit, or both. The State Board of Agriculture and Industries 8 shall review the action of the commissioner and make a finding 9 10 as to whether the certification or permit, or both, shall be issued or revoked. Any person denied or refused a 11 12 certification or permit or any person whose certification or 13 permit has been revoked by action of the commissioner shall 14 have the right to appear before the board and be heard in support of his appeal. Any person whose certification or 15 permit to perform work or services as regulated under this 16 17 chapter has been revoked shall not be eligible to have such a certification or permit again issued to him for a period of 18 not less than one year following the date on which such a 19 20 certification or permit was revoked. Nothing contained in this 21 chapter shall require the commissioner to issue a 22 certification or permit to any person who has been convicted 23 for a violation of this chapter or any person who has been 24 convicted of any felony listed under subsection (b) of Section 25 2-28-5 unless the person's civil rights have been restored. "§2-28-12. 26

"The provisions of this chapter shall apply only to 1 2 persons who solicit work and to persons engaging in a business or profession regulated under the provisions of this chapter, 3 4 but in no event shall it be construed so as to apply to any person employed by the owners or others in possession of 5 6 property to work under their supervision as an employee in 7 grafting, spraying, dusting cotton or other similar work or the custom application of pesticides as defined in subdivision 8 (6) of Section 2-27-50." 9

10 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the 11 first day of the third month following its passage and 12 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
