SB101 1 2 3 ENROLLED, An Act, 4 To amend Sections 27-7-4.4, 27-9A-17, and 27-25-4.6, 5 Code of Alabama 1975, relating to the licensing by the 6 Department of Insurance, insurance producers, title insurance 7 8 agents, and independent adjusters, and authorizing the Commissioner of Insurance to require the submission of 9 10 fingerprints for the purpose of criminal background checks; to 11 delete all reference to submitting and storing the electronic 12 fingerprint records with the National Association of Insurance 13 Commissioners for retention in a centralized repository and to 14 provide an exception for limited lines producers. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA: 15 Section 1. Sections 27-7-4.4, 27-9A-17, and 16 17 27-25-4.6, Code of Alabama 1975, are amended to read as 18 follows: "§27-7-4.4. 19 "(a) In order to make a determination of insurance 20 producer license eligibility, the commissioner is authorized 21 22 to require fingerprints of initial resident applicants for an 23 insurance producer license and to submit the fingerprints and 24 the fee required to perform the criminal history record checks 25 to the Alabama Department of Public Safety and the Federal

Bureau of Investigation (FBI) for state and national criminal
 history record checks.

3 "(b) The commissioner shall require a criminal history record check on each initial resident applicant for 4 5 insurance producer license in accordance with this section. The commissioner shall require each applicant to submit a full 6 set of fingerprints, including a scanned file from a hard copy 7 8 fingerprint, in order for the commissioner to obtain and receive national criminal history records from the FBI 9 Criminal Justice Information Services Division. 10

"(c) The commissioner may contract for the 11 collection, transmission, and resubmission of fingerprints 12 13 required under this section. If the commissioner does so, the 14 fee for collecting, transmitting, and retaining fingerprints 15 shall be payable directly to the contractor by the applicant. 16 The commissioner may agree to a reasonable fingerprinting fee 17 to be charged by the contractor and both the contractor's fee and the fee required to perform the criminal history check 18 19 shall be collected from the applicant by the contractor.

"(d) The commissioner may waive submission of
 fingerprints by any person who has previously furnished
 fingerprints and those fingerprints are on file with the
 centralized repository of the NAIC.

24 "(e)(d) The commissioner is authorized to receive
 25 criminal history record information in lieu of the Alabama

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Department of Public Safety that submitted the fingerprints to
 the FBI.

"(f) The commissioner is authorized to submit
electronic fingerprint records and necessary identifying
information to the NAIC for permanent retention in a
centralized repository. The purpose of such a centralized
repository is to provide insurance commissioners with access
to fingerprint records in order to perform criminal history
record checks.

"(g)(e) The commissioner shall treat and maintain an 10 applicant's fingerprints and any criminal history record 11 12 information obtained under this section as confidential and 13 shall apply security measures consistent with the Criminal Justice Information Services Division of the Federal Bureau of 14 15 Investigation standards for the electronic storage of 16 fingerprints and necessary identifying information and limit 17 the use of records solely to the purposes authorized in this 18 section. The fingerprints and any criminal history record 19 information shall not be subject to subpoena, other than one issued in a criminal action or investigation, and shall be 20 confidential. 21

22 "(h)(f) As used in this section, initial resident 23 applicant means an initial home state license and an 24 additional line of authority under an existing home state

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1 license where a criminal history record check has not been 2 obtained.

3 "(q) This section shall not apply to limited lines
4 producers as defined in Section 27-7-1.

5 "(i)(h) The commissioner may promulgate reasonable 6 regulations as are necessary or proper to carry out the 7 purposes of this section in accordance with Chapter 2 of this 8 title. The commissioner may by regulation provide for the 9 delayed enforcement of this section for up to 24 months 10 following January 1, 2013, the effective date of the act 11 <u>amending this subsection</u> to allow for implementation.

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"§27-9A-17.

"(a) In order to make a determination of license
eligibility, the commissioner may require fingerprints of
applicants and to submit the fingerprints and the fee required
to perform the criminal history record checks to the Alabama
Department of Public Safety and the Federal Bureau of
Investigation for state and national criminal history record
checks.

"(b) The commissioner may require a criminal history record check on each applicant in accordance with this section. The commissioner shall require each applicant to submit a full set of fingerprints, including a scanned file from a hard copy fingerprint, in order for the commissioner to obtain and receive national criminal history records from the

Criminal Justice Information Services Division of the Federal
 Bureau of Investigation. In the case of business entity
 applicants, the commissioner shall require the submission of
 fingerprints of all of the following:

5 "(1) All executive officers and directors of the 6 applicant.

7 "(2) Any individual owning, directly or indirectly,
8 51 percent or more of the outstanding voting securities of the
9 applicant.

10 "(3) All executive officers and directors of 11 entities owning 51 percent or more of the outstanding voting 12 securities of the applicant.

"(c) The commissioner may contract for the collection, transmission, and resubmission of fingerprints required under this section. If the commissioner does so, the fee for collecting, transmitting, and retaining fingerprints shall be payable directly to the contractor by the person. The commissioner may agree to a reasonable fingerprinting fee to be charged by the contractor.

"(d) The commissioner may waive submission of
fingerprints by any person that has previously furnished
fingerprints and those fingerprints are on file with the
centralized repository of the NAIC.

24 "(e)(d) The commissioner may receive criminal
 25 history record information from the Federal Bureau of

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Investigation in lieu of the information being submitted to the Alabama Department of Public Safety.

"(f) The commissioner may submit electronic
fingerprint records and necessary identifying information to
the NAIC for permanent retention in a centralized repository.
The purpose of such a centralized repository is to provide
insurance commissioners with access to fingerprint records in
order to perform criminal history record checks.

"(g) (e) The commissioner shall treat and maintain an 9 10 applicant's fingerprints and any criminal history record information obtained under this section as confidential and 11 12 shall apply security measures consistent with the Criminal 13 Justice Information Services Division of the Federal Bureau of 14 Investigation standards for the electronic storage of 15 fingerprints and necessary identifying information and limit 16 the use of records solely to the purposes authorized in this 17 section. The fingerprints and any criminal history record 18 information shall not be subject to subpoena, other than one 19 issued in a criminal action or investigation, and shall be confidential. 20

21 "(f) The commissioner, by regulation, may provide 22 for the delayed enforcement of this section for up to 24 23 months following the effective date of the act adding this 24 subsection to allow for implementation.

25 "§27-25-4.6.

"(a) In order to make a determination of title 1 2 insurance agent license eligibility, the commissioner may 3 require fingerprints of initial applicants for a title insurance agent license, and the fingerprints and the fee 4 5 required to perform the criminal history record checks shall be submitted to the Alabama Department of Public Safety and 6 the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) for state and 7 8 national criminal history record checks.

"(b) The commissioner shall require a criminal 9 10 history record check on each initial applicant for title insurance agent license pursuant to this section. The 11 commissioner shall require each applicant to submit a full set 12 13 of fingerprints, including a scanned file from a hard copy 14 fingerprint, to allow the commissioner to obtain and receive 15 national criminal history records from the FBI Criminal 16 Justice Information Services Division.

17 "(c) The commissioner may contract for the 18 collection, transmission, and resubmission of fingerprints 19 required pursuant to this section, and the fee for collecting, 20 transmitting, and retaining fingerprints shall be payable 21 directly to the contractor by the applicant. The commissioner 22 may agree to a reasonable fingerprinting fee to be charged by 23 the contractor, and both the contractor's fee and the fee 24 required to perform the criminal history check shall be 25 collected from the applicant by the contractor.

"(d) The commissioner may waive submission of 1 2 fingerprints by any person that has previously furnished 3 fingerprints and those fingerprints are on file with the centralized repository of the NAIC. 4 "(e)(d) The criminal history record information may 5 be submitted to the commissioner instead of the Alabama 6 Department of Public Safety. 7 "(f) The commissioner may submit electronic 8 fingerprint records and necessary identifying information to 9 10 the NAIC for permanent retention in a centralized repository. The purpose of a centralized repository is to provide 11 12 insurance commissioners with access to fingerprint records to 13 perform criminal history record checks. "(g) (e) The commissioner shall treat and maintain an 14 15 applicant's fingerprints and any criminal history record 16 information obtained pursuant to this section as confidential 17 and shall apply security measures consistent with the Criminal 18 Justice Information Services Division of the Federal Bureau of 19 Investigation standards for the electronic storage of fingerprints and necessary identifying information and limit 20 the use of records solely to the purposes authorized in this 21 22 section. The fingerprints and any criminal history record 23 information shall not be subject to subpoena, other than one issued in a criminal action or investigation, and shall be 24 25 confidential.

1	"(f) The commissioner, by regulation, may provide
2	for the delayed enforcement of this section for up to 24
3	months from the effective date of the act adding this
4	subsection to allow for delayed implementation."
5	Section 2. This act shall become effective
6	immediately following its passage and approval by the
7	Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
