SB113 1 2 3 ENROLLED, An Act, 4 5 Relating to court payments; to amend Section 12-19-290, Code of Alabama 1975, to allow circuit and district 6 7 courts to accept credit card, charge card, and debit card 8 payments; to expand the types of payments for which credit cards, charge cards, and debit cards are authorized; to 9 10 authorize certain surcharges or convenience fees; and to 11 ratify and confirm any surcharges or convenience fees charged 12 and collected prior to the effective date of this act. 13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA: 14 Section 1. Section 12-19-290, Code of Alabama 1975, shall be amended to read as follows: 15 "\$12-19-290. 16 17 "(a) The Advanced Technology and Data Exchange Fund 18 is created in the State Treasury. 19 "(b) The fund shall consist of all monies paid into the State Treasury to the credit of the fund pursuant to 20 21 Section 12-19-181 or by legislative appropriations, grant, 22 gift, or otherwise. 23 "(c) Monies contained in the Advanced Technology and 24 Data Exchange Fund may be expended to provide for any

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activities involving the administration of justice including,
 but not limited to, the following purposes:

3 "(1) Expand methods and means for collection and 4 disbursement of court-ordered monies through the use of credit 5 cards, electronic fund transfers, or other means and provide 6 for electronic transfer of records and storage.

"(2) Enhance coordination and sharing of data with
local, state, and federal agencies, members of the bar, and
the public.

10 "(3) Provide equipment for electronically filing 11 cases.

12 "(4) Improve accountability for case filings and13 dispositions.

14 "(5) Train and educate employees and officials on 15 the state and municipal levels of the Unified Judicial System 16 regarding legal and administrative policies and procedures and 17 effective usage of the courts' management systems.

18 "(6) Provide education materials including, but not 19 limited to, manuals, forms, handbooks, books, brochures, and 20 technology for legal research and case management for court 21 officials and employees and component groups of the legal 22 community.

"(7) Provide staff, services, and equipment required
to maintain and expand technological improvements and conduct
continuing education and training in these areas.

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"(8) Pay service charges, electronic transfer fees,

2	or any other transaction costs associated with subdivisions
3	(1) to (7), inclusive.
4	"All such costs shall be paid out of funds
5	appropriated to the Advanced Technology and Data Exchange Fund
6	and shall not reduce amounts due to be distributed to other
7	governmental funds or entities.
8	"(d) <u>(1)</u> The <u>Subject to the adoption of uniform rules</u>
9	by the Administrative Office of Courts, the clerks of the
10	circuit and district courts may accept credit cards, charge
11	<u>cards,</u> or debit cards approved by the Administrative Director
12	of Courts issued from any bank, foreign lender, domestic
13	lender, or credit card bank as defined in Section 5-20-3 for
14	the payment of court costs, fees, fines, forfeitures,
15	judgments, restitution, attorney fees, any monies collected
16	and payable to individuals, businesses or partnerships, or any
17	person or entity or assessments of any kind. The following are
18	specifically excluded from payment by credit cards or debit
19	cards: Judgments, restitution, attorney fees, any monies
20	collected and payable to individuals, businesses,
21	partnerships, or any person or entity other than a
22	governmental agency or department. Any other provision of law
23	to the contrary notwithstanding, the clerk of the court or
24	agent thereof accepting payment as provided for in this
25	subsection shall impose and collect a surcharge or convenience

1	fee in respect of payments made by credit card, charge card,
2	or debit card for any of the above in an amount not exceeding
3	the sum of the following: a. the transaction fee or discount
4	charged by the credit card, charge card, or debit card issuer
5	or processor with respect to such payments; and b. any cost or
6	fee charged with respect to the payments pursuant to agreement
7	between the Administrative Office of Courts and a contracting
8	entity which provides software, support, and management
9	services in connection with the acceptance of payment by
10	credit card, charge card, or debit card by the clerks of the
11	circuit and district courts as provided herein.
12	"(2) The imposition and validity of any surcharges
13	or convenience fees heretofore charged and collected by clerks
14	of the circuit or district courts or their agents prior to the
15	effective date of the act adding this subdivision are hereby

15 <u>effective date of the act adding this subdivision are hereby</u> 16 <u>ratified and confirmed.</u>

17 "(e) The Administrative Director of Courts or any 18 municipality may contract with any company that issues credit 19 cards to collect and seize credit cards issued by any company that are outdated or otherwise unauthorized. The state or 20 21 municipality may charge the company a fee for the return of 22 the credit cards. Any fees collected pursuant to this 23 subsection by state courts shall be deposited into the Advanced Technology and Data Exchange Fund and the fees 24

1	collected by a municipal court shall be deposited into the
2	general fund of the municipality.
3	"(f) Procedures for implementing the provisions of
4	Act 99-427 may be promulgated as Rules of Judicial
5	Administration adopted by the Supreme Court of Alabama.
6	"(g) At the end of any fiscal year, any unexpended
7	or unencumbered monies contributed to or deposited in the fund
8	from any source, except appropriations from other state funds,
9	shall remain in the fund.
10	"(h) The clerk of any court shall not be liable to
11	any person for any action taken pursuant to this section if he
12	or she acts in accordance with the rules adopted by the
13	Administrative Office of Courts."
14	Section 2. This act shall become effective on the
15	first day of the third month following its passage and
16	approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
