26		AN ACT
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Relating to unemployment compensation; to require each person receiving unemployment compensation to perform community service; to provide that any person receiving unemployment compensation who does not perform community service shall be ineligible to receive the compensation; and to provide procedures and exceptions for the mandatory community service programs to be developed by the Alabama Department of Labor in conjunction with the Alabama Department of Human Resources.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. As used in this act, the term "department" shall mean the Alabama Department of Labor.

Section 2. (a) Except where exempted by federal law, on and after July 1, 2015, each person receiving unemployment compensation shall be required to participate in a community service program administered by the department.

(b) The department, in conjunction with the Alabama Department of Human Resources shall establish and administer a community service program with the standards and procedures deemed necessary to accomplish the requirements of this section. The department shall establish a minimum number of hours of regulated community service to be required for each person receiving unemployment compensation, which shall be a minimum of 16 hours of community service per week for each person. The department, on a monthly basis, shall issue a list of nonprofit 501(c)(3) programs which are eligible for community service work required under this section. No

eligible nonprofit program shall be required to accept a person receiving unemployment compensation for community service but shall be encouraged to do so. Volunteer service at a public or private school shall qualify for mandatory community service required under this section. Volunteer service at a church where the person receiving unemployment compensation is a member shall not qualify for mandatory community service required under this section. The department shall issue regulations prescribing forms and procedures for the verification of community service required by the person receiving unemployment compensation.

- (c) A person receiving unemployment compensation who does not comply with the mandatory community service required shall be ineligible to receive the benefits for a period of time to be enforced by the department granting the benefits as follows:
- (1) For the first noncompliance, a period of 30 days.
- (2) For the second noncompliance, a period of 60 days.
- (3) For the third and subsequent noncompliance, a period of one year, after which time the person shall be required to submit to a mandatory community service program before he or she shall be eligible to receive unemployment compensation.
- (d) A recipient who receives federal, state, or local public benefits who refuses to submit to the mandatory

- community service program shall be ineligible to receive the benefits for a period of one year.
- 3 (e) This section shall be enforced without regard to 4 race, religion, gender, ethnicity, or national origin.

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(f) The provisions of this section shall be implemented after the date the department has received all federal waivers that are necessary to implement the provisions of this section from the United States Department of Health and Human Services.

Section 3. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
