BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA: 9 10 Section 1. There is hereby appropriated for the 11 support of public education in Alabama for the fiscal year 12 ending September 30, 2015, for debt service, and for capital 13 outlay to be paid out of funds specified in subsection (a) of 14 Section 2 of this act, the amounts specified in subsections 15 (a), (b), (c), (d), and (e) of Section 3 of this act. For the 16 purpose specified in subsection (b) of Section 2 of this act, 17 amounts are shown by programmatic area and the total for all 18 programs is shown so as to include estimated sources of funds 19 other than those listed in subsection (a) of Section 2 of this act. For the purpose of this act, "ETF" shall mean the 20 Education Trust Fund and "Federal and Local Funds" shall mean 21 22 all gifts, grants, contributions, or entitlements, including 23 grants by the Congress of the United States, municipalities or 24 counties.

Section 2. (a) The appropriations provided for in 1 2 this act shall be paid from funds in the State Treasury to the 3 credit of the Education Trust Fund, Alabama Peace Officers' Standards and Training Fund, Impaired Drivers Trust Fund, 4 5 Driver Education and Training Fund, Special Education Catastrophic Fund, and Public School Fund and are hereby made 6 7 for the support of public education in Alabama for the fiscal 8 year ending September 30, 2015, and the appropriations herein 9 made shall be subject to the provisions, terms, conditions and 10 limitations of the Budget and Financial Control Act (Code of 11 Alabama 1975, Sections 41-4-80 et seq.), the provisions of the Budget Management Act of 1976 (Code of Alabama 1975, Sections 12 13 41-19-1 et seq.), and shall be in the amounts hereinafter 14 specified.

15 (b) Amounts shown hereinunder the columns "Earmarked 16 Funds" and "Appropriation Total" are as set forth for the 17 purpose of establishing amounts estimated to be available by 18 programmatic area from sources other than those listed in subsection (a) of this Section 2, in order, upon consideration 19 of such other funds so estimated to be available, to promote 20 21 the accountability for an efficient use of funds available, 22 and the same are hereby appropriated by the Legislature. The above funds appropriated for workforce development shall be expended primarily for the training of Alabama residents. It is further the intent that contracts with vendors to provide workforce training shall be inclusive and reflect the racial and gender diversity of the State. The Secretary of the Department of Commerce shall report quarterly to the Chairs of the Senate Committee on Finance and Taxation - Education and the House Ways and Means Education Committee and the Legislative Fiscal Officer any funds allocated for workforce training. Such report shall include a summary of the persons trained and the vendors providing the training. The report shall contain information including the residence, race and gender of the persons trained and of the principal or majority owner of the firm or business contracted with to provide the training services.

The above appropriation shall be distributed by the State Board of Education in accordance with the provisions of the Code of Alabama 1975, Sections 16-13-230 through 16-13-239, and all other laws and regulations of the State Board of Education relating to the expenditure of such funds. These funds shall be used to provide a minimum school term of 180 full instructional days, or the hourly equivalent thereof, and for equitable educational opportunities in the public schools of the State. Foundation Program calculations for FY 2014-2015 are based on the funding divisors set forth below. Units earned under the Foundation Program shall be employed as regular classroom teachers and assigned by the local board of education. The divisors listed below shall not serve to prescribe pupil-teacher ratios. It is the intent of the Legislature that local boards of education have flexibility in determining where reductions are made. Any reductions made using flexibility of state units must comply with federal comparability and supplanting guidelines. Each district will submit an application for approval by the State Superintendent as to the unit allocation adjustments requested.

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Notwithstanding Section 16-13-231.1(d) of the Code of Alabama 1975, there shall not be an appropriation for the 1% over the total cost of instructional salaries for the Foundation Program as calculated by the State Minimum Salary Schedule for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2014. For "Fringe Benefits" the rate per day for two personal days and five sick days (for units earned in the Foundation Program) shall be \$60. The Teachers' Retirement System employer rate shall be 11.71% of salaries for Tier I members and 11.05% of salaries for Tier II members. The total employer costs estimated to be paid into the Teachers' Retirement System for Fiscal Year 2015 amounts to \$748,476,589. The Public Education Employees' Health Insurance Program (PEEHIP) rate shall be \$780 per month for each full-time employee. The total employer costs estimated to be paid in to the Public Education Employees' Health Insurance Fund for Fiscal Year 2015 amounts to \$901,926,244. It is the intent of the Legislature that the Board, in an effort to minimize the out-of-pocket costs to active and retired members, shall, if necessary, utilize the Alabama Retired Education Employees' Health Care Trust up to the amount of the costs paid on behalf of retirees in the plan but not to exceed 10% of the trust balance as of October 1, 2014. As funds are appropriated, the appropriation herein shall include funds to pay for substitute support employees for each day a support employee is absent.

For "Classroom Instructional Support" the uniform amounts used in determining the Foundation Program allowance for classroom instructional support shall be: (1) textbooks or digital resources at \$35.00 per pupil in average daily membership during the first 20 scholastic days after Labor Day of the preceding school year and (2) classroom materials and supplies at \$310.00 per unit earned in the Foundation Program. Funds allocated for instructional support units to meet Advanced Education standards may be used for principals, assistant principals, counselors, and librarians as calculated by the State Department of Education and assigned to the schools where such units are earned. An instructional support unit earned for a principal shall be increased by .31 for elementary schools, .35 for middle schools, and .45 for secondary schools and unit schools. An instructional support unit earned for an assistant principal shall be increased by .10 for elementary schools, middle schools, secondary schools and unit schools. An instructional support unit earned for a counselor shall be increased by .03 for secondary schools and unit schools. The budgeting and expenditure of funds in the Foundation Program at the local level shall be determined and made by the local board of education in accordance with

14 Section 4. In addition to the appropriations herein 15 made, all gifts, grants, contributions, insurance proceeds or 16 entitlements, in excess of the amount carried in this act, 17 including grants by the Congress of the United States, municipalities or counties, to any department, division, 18 board, bureau, commission, agency, institution, office or 19 20 officer of the State of Alabama are hereby appropriated and, 21 in the event the same are recurring, are reappropriated to 22 such department, division, board, bureau, commission, agency, 23 institution, office or officer to be used only for the purpose 24 or purposes for which the grant or contribution was or shall 25 be made. Further, all state, county, municipal and educational 26 entities are authorized to disburse such sums as deemed 27 necessary by mutual agreement between said entities and the

State of Alabama, Department of Examiners of Public Accounts to partially defray the cost of auditing services performed by said agency. All such sums are hereby appropriated and reappropriated if necessary to the Department of Examiners of Public Accounts for audit services, to be expended through the fund established by Section 41-5-24, Code of Alabama 1975.

Section 5. The State Superintendent of Education 7 8 shall make requisitions to the State Comptroller in favor of 9 the proper beneficiary in accordance with the law and rules 10 and regulations governing the expenditure or disbursement of any and all funds appropriated to the State Department of 11 Education and/or the State Board of Education in this act, 12 13 whereupon the Comptroller shall issue his warrant therefor. 14 All other appropriations in this act shall be paid after 15 proper requisitions are made to the State Comptroller in the 16 manner now provided by law.

17 Section 6. Nothing in this act shall be construed to affect or repeal any law authorizing or permitting any 18 19 college, school or other education or eleemosynary institution 20 of the State to receive, collect or disburse any fees, 21 tuitions, charges, sales, endowments, trusts or income 22 therefrom, which are now or may hereafter be authorized to 23 receive, collect or disburse. The receiving college, school or 24 institution shall further maintain separate accounts for such 25 receipts or shall maintain a system of accounting which will

1 show a cash flow of such receipts received under the provision

3 Section 7. The appropriations made herein to the departments, boards, offices, commissions, and agencies 4 5 include the amounts necessary and said departments, boards, offices, commissions, and agencies are hereby directed to make 6 the transfer of funds to the State Personnel Department in the 7 8 amounts enumerated in the general appropriations act for the 9 fiscal year ending September 30, 2015. All agencies and 10 institutions enumerated in this act that receive services from other governmental agencies enumerated in this act or the 11 general appropriations act shall make full payment in a timely 12 13 manner (as determined by the Department of Finance) for such 14 services.

15 Section 8. All encumbered balances of a previous 16 fiscal year appropriation other than the exclusions authorized 17 by the Code of Alabama 1975, Section 41-4-93, shall lapse no 18 later than September 30 of the fiscal year immediately 19 following the fiscal year for which the appropriation was made and shall revert to the credit of the Education Trust Fund or 20 21 earmarked fund from which the appropriation or appropriations 22 were made.

23 Section 9. Upon certification to the Director of 24 Finance by the State Attorney General that a federal court has 25 ordered the State of Alabama to pay claims, attorney fees, or

other costs relating to said court order, funds are hereby 1 2 appropriated to the affected department, board, bureau, or 3 commission in the amount necessary to satisfy that court order. Such appropriations are in addition to any other 4 5 appropriation heretofore or hereafter made in this 6 appropriation act. Such appropriations are conditioned upon the availability of funds and a determination by the Director 7 8 of Finance that other current appropriations are not available 9 for court-ordered payments.

10 Section 10. For FY 2015, local boards of education 11 may exercise flexibility among line item expenditures, not to 12 create a reduction of earned teacher units and/or local board 13 of education support personnel.

14 Section 11. The State Superintendent of Education may approve a request by a local board of education for 15 redirecting Other Current Expense funds designated for 16 17 pass-through calculations to their local Child Nutrition 18 Program if the redirected funds do not prevent the Child 19 Nutrition Program of that local board of education from 20 maintaining a fund balance equal to or greater than a 21 two-month operating reserve.

22 Section 12. The appropriations made herein to the 23 departments, boards, offices, commissions and agencies include 24 the amounts necessary to pay the State Employees' Insurance 25 Board (SEIB). The SEIB rate shall be \$825 per month for each

full-time employee for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2 2015. The State Employees' Insurance Board will adjust the 3 insurance program wherever appropriate to maintain the 4 aforementioned fixed rate.

5 Section 13. Notwithstanding any other provisions of this act or any other act, any amount from appropriations for 6 the fiscal year ending September 30, 2014 to the various state 7 8 agencies and institutions in this act, except appropriations from the Education Trust Fund, which are unexpended and 9 10 reverted on September 30, 2014 are hereby reappropriated to the respective state agencies, offices and institutions for 11 the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2014. 12

13 Section 14. If any section, paragraph, sentence, 14 clause, provision or portion of this act or all or any portion 15 of the appropriations herein made is held unconstitutional or 16 invalid, it shall not affect any other section, paragraph, 17 sentence, clause, provision or portion of this act or any 18 other appropriation or appropriations or portion thereof 19 hereby made not in and of itself unconstitutional or invalid.

20 Section 15. All laws or parts of laws, general, 21 special, private or local in conflict with or inconsistent 22 with the provisions of this act are hereby expressly repealed.

23 Section 16. This act shall become effective on 24 October 1, 2014.
