26	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

1 Section 1. The following amendment to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended by Amendment 509, 2 is proposed and shall become valid as a part thereof when 3 4 approved by a majority of the qualified electors voting thereon and in accordance with Sections 284, 285 and 287 of 5 the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended. 6 7 PROPOSED AMENDMENT Amendment 509 to the Constitution of Alabama of 8 1901, now appearing as Section 36.01 of the Official 9 10 Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, is amended to read as follows: 11 12 "(a) English is the official language of the State 13 of Alabama. The Legislature shall enforce this amendment by 14 appropriate legislation. The Legislature and officials of the 15 State of Alabama shall take all steps necessary to insure that 16 the role of English as the common language of the State of 17 Alabama is preserved and enhanced. The Legislature shall not enact any law which diminishes or ignores the role of English 18 as the common language of the State of Alabama. 19 "(b) English shall be the language of any official 20 21 proceeding in this state. 22 "(c) As used in this amendment, "official 23 proceeding" means any meeting of a public governmental body at 24 which any public business is discussed, decided, or public 25 policy formulated, whether the meeting is conducted in person or by means of communication equipment, including, but not 26 27 limited to, conference call, video conference, Internet chat,

1 or Internet message board. The term includes a public vote of 2 all or a majority of the members of a public governmental body, by electronic communication or any other means, 3 conducted in lieu of holding an official proceeding with the 4 members of the public governmental body gathered at one 5 6 location in order to conduct public business. The term does 7 not include an informal gathering of members of a public governmental body for ministerial or social purposes. 8

9 "(d) Any person who is a resident of or doing 10 business in the State of Alabama shall have standing to sue 11 the State of Alabama to enforce this amendment, and the courts 12 of record of the State of Alabama shall have jurisdiction to 13 hear cases brought to enforce this provision. The Legislature 14 may provide reasonable and appropriate limitations on the time 15 and manner of suits brought under this amendment."

Section 2. An election upon the proposed amendment shall be in accordance with Sections 284 and 285 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Sections 284 and 285 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, and the election laws of this state.

22 Section 3. The appropriate election official shall 23 assign a ballot number for the proposed constitutional 24 amendment on the election ballot and shall set forth the 25 following description of the substance or subject matter of 26 the proposed constitutional amendment: "Proposing an amendment to Amendment 509 to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Section 36.01 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, to authorize the Legislature to provide that English shall be the language of all official proceedings in this state.
