1 acting within the line and scope of their official duties 2 within the definition of "governmental entity." BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA: 3 4 Section 1. Section 11-93-1, Code of Alabama 1975, is amended to read as follows: 5 "\$11-93-1. 6 7 "For the purposes of this chapter, the following terms shall have the meanings ascribed to them by this 8 9 section: 10 "(1) GOVERNMENTAL ENTITY. Any incorporated municipality, any county, and any department, agency, board, 11 12 or commission of any municipality or county, municipal or 13 county public corporations, and any such instrumentality or 14 instrumentalities acting jointly. "Governmental entity" shall 15 also include county public school boards, municipal public school boards and city-county school boards when such boards 16 17 do not operate as functions of the State of Alabama. "Governmental entity" shall also mean county or city hospital 18 boards when such boards are instrumentalities of the 19 20 municipality or county or organized pursuant to authority from 21 a municipality or county. The term shall also include any 22 employee of the governmental entity as defined in subdivision 23 (2).

"(2) EMPLOYEE. An officer, official, employee, or
servant of a governmental entity, including elected or
appointed officials, and persons acting on behalf of any
governmental entity in any official capacity <u>within the line</u>

1 and scope of his or her employment or duties, temporarily or 2 permanently, in the service of the governmental entity, 3 whether with or without compensation, but the term "employee" 4 shall not mean a person or other legal entity while acting in 5 the capacity of an independent contractor under contract to 6 the governmental entity to which this chapter applies in the 7 event of a claim.

8 "(3) BODILY INJURY. Any bodily injury, sickness, 9 disease, or death sustained by any person or caused by an 10 occurrence.

"(4) PROPERTY DAMAGE. Injury or destruction totangible property caused by an occurrence.

13 "(5) CLAIM. Any claim against a governmental entity, 14 for money damages only, which any person is legally entitled to recover as damages caused by bodily injury or property 15 damage caused by a negligent or wrongful act or omission 16 17 committed by any employee of the governmental entity while acting within the scope of his or her employment, under 18 circumstances where the governmental entity, if a private 19 person, would be liable to the claimant for such damages under 20 21 the laws of the State of Alabama. A claim against an employee 22 acting within the line and scope of his or her employment or 23 duties is a claim against the employing governmental entity 24 and not a claim against the employee in his or her personal or 25 individual capacity."

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Section 2. This act is declaratory of existing law.

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Section 3. This act shall become effective
 immediately following its passage and approval by the
 Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
