24	Relating to the Department of Public Safety; to
25	require the Director of the Department of Public Safety and
26	the Alabama State Personnel Department to establish a
27	classification of Trooper First Class for persons who are

initially employed as state troopers by the department and
establish a pay scale for the classification; and to allow the
State of Alabama to recover the costs for educating and
training employees for initial employment who remain employed
less than a certain period of time.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. The Director of the Department of Public Safety and the Alabama State Personnel Department shall establish a classification of Trooper First Class for persons who have been employed as state troopers for three years or more and compensate them according to pay grade 7576 of the State of Alabama Personnel Department compensation plan.

Section 2. Notwithstanding any provision of law, the State of Alabama may recover the actual training costs incurred for a person employed as a law enforcement officer with the State of Alabama if the person does not maintain full-time employment for three years after his or her initial employment with the State of Alabama. The State of Alabama may recover the cost of the law enforcement training from any other agency or entity that hires the employee as a law enforcement officer within three years of his or her initial employment with the State of Alabama.

Section 3. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
