21	Section 1. For purposes of this act, the following

23	(1) EMPLOYEE. An individual employed in this state

25	(2) EMPLOYER. A person engaging in any activity,

Section 2. (a) A county, municipality, or any 1 2 political subdivision in this state may not enact or administer an ordinance, policy, rule, or other mandate 3 4 requiring an employer to provide any employee or any class of employees with vacation or other forms of leave from 5 6 employment, paid or unpaid, that is not required by state or 7 federal law, and may not require an employer to compensate an employee for any vacation or other forms of leave for which 8 state or federal law does not require the employee to be 9 10 compensated.

(b) This section does not apply to any mandate enacted by a county, municipality, or political subdivision of this state relating to vacation or other forms of leave for an employee or class of employees of the political subdivision.

Section 3. Any ordinance, policy, rule, or other mandate of a political subdivision of this state that is inconsistent with this act is void.

Section 4. This act shall become effective immediately following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.

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
