The purpose or effect of this bill would be to require a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of the amendment. However,

1 (b) A dump truck may not be driven on any highway of
2 this state with the bed of the truck raised to more than a
3 20-degree angle except when the dump truck is actively engaged
4 in dumping its load.

- (c) A violation of this section is a Class C misdemeanor on the first offense. Any second or subsequent offense is a Class B misdemeanor.
- (d) This section may be enforced by any law enforcement officer. At the scene of an accident, a law enforcement officer may give a citation for a violation if the officer has reasonable cause to believe a violation has been committed even if the officer did not witness the violation.
- (e) This section shall not be construed to repeal any other criminal law. Whenever conduct prohibited by this section is also prohibited by any other provision of law, the provision that carries the more serious penalty shall be applied.
- Section 2. This act shall be known as "The Ricky Morgan Act."

Section 3. Although this bill would have as its purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of local funds, the bill is excluded from further requirements and application under Amendment 621 because the bill defines a new crime or amends the definition of an existing crime.

Section 4. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
