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1 or in part by the state are hereby directed to purchase such 2 articles the products or services from the Department of Adult Blind and Deaf. All political subdivisions of the state are 3 4 authorized to purchase articles or services made, provided, or 5 manufactured by the blind, visually handicapped, deaf or severely handicapped individuals with disabilities through the 6 7 department in the same manner that the state and its agencies and institutions purchase them. A fair market price for all 8 articles offered for sale pursuant to this chapter shall be 9 10 determined by the board created in Section 21-2-3. The board shall also ensure services approved do not adversely impact 11 12 services provided under the Randolph-Sheppard Act of 1936, 20 U.S.C. 107 et seq., a vendor program for the hiring of 13 14 individuals who are blind for the operation of vending 15 facilities on state and federal property, as administered by the Department of Rehabilitation Services." 16 17 Section 2. This act shall become effective

immediately following its passage and approval by the

Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.

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
