21	To establish the office of the State Climatologist;

24	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
25	Section 1. The office of State Climatologist is
26	created within this state. The administrative and executive
27	head of the office shall be known as the State Climatologist.

The President of the University of Alabama in Huntsville shall appoint a person to serve as the State Climatologist and a person as Assistant State Climatologist, each appointment subject to the approval of the Governor, and shall fix the salary of the State Climatologist and Assistant State Climatologist. The State Climatologist shall serve at the will of the appointing authority. Whenever a vacancy in either office occurs, the vacancy shall be filled in a like manner as the original appointment, and the tenure of office shall be at the will of the appointing authority.

Section 2. (a) During their course of employment as State Climatologist and Assistant State Climatologist under the conditions set forth in this act, shall be permitted to teach graduate or undergraduate courses at the University of Alabama in Huntsville which are connected with or related to the study of climatology or affiliated or associated subjects.

- (b) The teaching of courses by the State Climatologist and the Assistant State Climatologist shall be permitted if the teaching duties do not unduly interfere with their duties as State Climatologist and Assistant State Climatologist.
- (c) Teaching the courses shall be limited to courses which require not more than an aggregate of six hours of resident classroom teaching per week. The teaching shall be permitted during regular scholastic terms, summer school courses, or classes for special students as provided by the curricula of the University of Alabama in Huntsville.

(d) The act of teaching by the State Climatologist and the Assistant State Climatologist shall not entitle either of them to participate as members or to enjoy the privileges or benefits of membership of the Teachers' Retirement System of Alabama.

Section 3. Subject to the provisions of the Merit System, the State Climatologist may appoint, with the approval of the Governor, assistants and with compensation as he or she may deem necessary to the fulfillment of his or her duties as set forth in Sections 4 and 5. The assistants shall devote their entire time to the work of those duties, and no part of the funds available to the State Climatologist shall be expended for the salary or compensation in whole or in part of any member of the teaching staff or other employee of the University of Alabama in Huntsville.

Section 4. The State Climatologist shall assist the state in understanding and responding to natural and man-induced climate processes and their implications, shall cooperate with the federal government in activities relating to climate studies and advisory services, shall promote and disseminate general knowledge of the climatology of the state, shall establish a state climate program in accordance with the provisions of the National Climate Program Act and regulations promulgated pursuant to that act, shall seek and utilize grants made available to the state pursuant to the provisions of the National Climate Program Act and other grants, gifts,

- donations, or bequests from any source to be used in carrying out its purpose.
- Section 5. (a) The duties of the State Climatologist shall include, but not limited to, the following:

- (1) Assessing the effect of climate on the natural environment, agricultural production, land and natural resources, and human health.
- (2) Coordinating climate impact studies and programs to improve understanding of climate processes, natural and man-induced, and of the social and economic implications of climate change.
- (3) Developing methods and procedures to enable interested state agencies and public institutions of higher education to participate in the program.
- (4) Disseminating climate data, information, advice, and assessments to state agencies, local public bodies, and the general public.
- (5) Establishing an effective mechanism for consultation and coordination with the federal government and other states in climate related activities.
- (6) Administering the state intergovernmental climate program.
- (b) In carrying out the responsibilities enumerated in this section, the State Climatologist shall seek the assistance of the Atmospheric Science Program at the University of Alabama in Huntsville and other appropriate agencies and facilities for scientific support.

Section 6. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
