9		scheduling of a special election to fill a vacancy

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To amend Section 17-15-1, Code of Alabama 1975, 2 relating to special elections; to provide that the Governor 3 shall fill a vacancy in the office of senator or representative in the Legislature if the vacancy occurs after 5 6 the last day of the third regular session in any quadrennium 7 of the Legislature; to provide the procedure for filling the vacancy; and to provide that the effective date would be 8 contingent on the ratification of an amendment to the 9 10 Constitution of Alabama of 1901, providing authorization.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. Section 17-15-1, Code of Alabama 1975, is amended to read as follows:

"\$17-15-1.

- "(a) Special elections are to be held in the following cases:
 - "(1) When Except as provided in subsection (b), when a vacancy occurs in the office of senator or representative in the Legislature, when the Legislature will be in session prior to the next general election for that office.
 - "(2) When a vacancy occurs in the office of representative in the Congress of the United States, by which the state may be deprived of its full representation at any time Congress will be in session prior to the next general election for that office.

"(3) Whenever any general or special election for members of the Legislature or for representatives in Congress is not held.

- "(4) When any vacancy occurs in any state or county office filled by election of the people not otherwise provided for by the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, or laws of this state.
- 8 "(5) In such other cases as are or may be provided 9 for by law.
 - "(b) If a vacancy occurs in the office of senator or representative in the Legislature after the last day of the third regular session in any quadrennium of the Legislature, the Governor shall appoint a person within 60 calendar days following the first day of the vacancy to fill the vacancy for the unexpired term by selecting a person from a list of three prospective appointees submitted by the same political party as the vacating member. The appointee, at the time of his or her appointment and for at least six months immediately prior to the appointment, shall be a member of the same political party and a resident of the same legislative district as the vacating member. The political party of the vacating member shall submit a list of three prospective appointees to the Governor within 30 calendar days following the first day of the vacancy.

"If the vacating member was not a member of any political party, the Governor, within 60 calendar days following the first day of the vacancy, shall appoint a person

1	who is at the time of appointment a resident of the same
2	legislative district as the vacating member and who is not,
3	and has not been for at least six months prior to the
4	appointment, a member of any political party.
5	"The person appointed by the Governor to fill the
6	legislative vacancy may not run as a candidate in the next
7	general election following his or her appointment."
8	Section 2. This act shall become effective on the
9	first day of the third month following its passage and
10	approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law, if,
11	and only if, an amendment to the Constitution of Alabama of
12	1901, is ratified which authorizes the Governor to appoint a
13	person to fill a vacancy in the office of senator or
14	representative in the Legislature pursuant to this act.
