27	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the Virtual Public Schools Act.

Section 2. The purpose of this act is to provide parents, guardians, and the State Department of Education with an alternative choice for offering additional educational resources in an effort to improve academic achievement.

Section 3. For the purposes of this act, a virtual school is a public school in which the school uses technology in order to deliver a significant portion of instruction to its students via the Internet in a virtual setting.

Section 4. A virtual school may be established by the State Department of Education according to rules promulgated by the State Board of Education. A virtual school is a public K-12 school that is associated with a local board of education and shall be provided resources as any other public school in the state. Nothing in this act shall require the appropriation of locally assessed and collected revenue earmarked for local education purposes to be appropriated to virtual schools unless specifically authorized by the local board of education.

Section 5. A virtual school shall provide each student enrolled in the school with all of the following:

- (1) Access to a curriculum that meets or exceeds the curriculum standards adopted by the State Board of Education.
- (2) The same number of instructional days, or the hourly equivalent thereof, for learning opportunities per academic year that is required under Section 16-13-231, Code

- of Alabama 1975, for public school students. A student, at his or her own pace, may demonstrate mastery or completion of a course or subject area and be given credit for the course or subject area.
 - (3) Regular assessment in language arts, math, science, and social studies.

- Section 6. For each family with a student enrolled, the virtual school shall do all of the following:
 - (1) Provide instructional materials.
 - (2) Ensure materials and access to necessary technology such as computer, printer, and Internet connection used for school work or, at minimum, through a physical computer lab that is available to the student through regularly scheduled times.
 - Section 7. A virtual school may not provide assistance to students or families to purchase instructional programs or materials.
 - Section 8. Each teacher employed at a virtual school shall be certified and highly qualified to teach in this state under existing law.
 - Section 9. Nothing in this act shall preclude the use of computer-based and Internet-based instruction for students in a virtual setting.
 - Section 10. Any student who is eligible for enrollment in a public school in this state may enroll in a virtual school as either a full-time virtual school student or as a part-time virtual school student taking some of his or

her courses through the virtual school. A student who enrolls in a virtual school shall remain enrolled with his or her local school system, earn credits through that local school system, and receive his or her diploma through that local school system. A student who enrolls in a virtual school may also continue to participate in extracurricular activities through his or her local school system. A local board of education may charge tuition to any person not enrolled in a public school within the local board of education district for attendance in a local board of education established virtual school.

Section 11. A virtual school shall be held to the same standards as all other schools under the jurisdiction of the local board of education and the accountability and viability of the virtual school, as demonstrated by its academic, fiscal, and operational performance, shall be annually reviewed by the State Department of Education.

Section 12. The State Department of Education may contract with nonprofit and for-profit entities for management services provided by the virtual school.

Section 13. The State Board of Education shall promulgate rules to effectuate the purposes of this act. All such rules shall be promulgated in accordance with the Alabama Administrative Procedure Act, Chapter 22, Title 41, Code of Alabama 1975.

Section 14. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
