24	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
25	Section 1. (a) Under the direction of the Alabama
26	Council of College and University Presidents, the public
27	institutions of higher education in the state shall coordinate

efforts to create a library of digital textbooks for use in public K-12 schools in the state. The digital textbook library shall be easily accessible to and continuously monitored by the council, or an agent selected by the council, to ensure that any errors are quickly corrected and that the material covered in each digital textbook is updated as necessary.

(b) The digital textbooks shall cover all subject
matters taught in the public K-12 schools, shall be available
for free download to electronic devices through the state
supercomputer, and shall be in a format that may be printed,
on demand, without extraneous information or data.

12 (c) The State Textbook Committee shall review all 13 digital textbooks created under this act to ensure that the 14 content of each textbook is balanced and does not proselytize 15 a particular view. Digital textbooks covering the subjects of 16 literature and English shall emphasize traditional classics.

(d) A digital textbook created pursuant to this act
is state property and not subject to any publication or
duplication fee. The State Board of Education, or any local
board of education, may have digital textbooks printed and
published in book form for use by students.

22 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the 23 first day of the third month following its passage and 24 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
