13 Relating to Elmore County; to authorize the City
14 Council of the City of Millbrook and the City Council of the
15 City of Wetumpka, respectively, to provide for the sale of
16 draft beer, with certain exceptions, by certain retail
17 licensees of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board.

18 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

19 Section 1. The City Council of the City of Millbrook
20 and the City Council of the City of Wetumpka, by resolution or
21 ordinance, may each respectively authorize the sale and
22 distribution of draft beer by retail licensees of the
23 Alcoholic Beverage Control Board within the corporate limits
24 of the city each respective city council represents.
25 Notwithstanding the foregoing, keg beer may not be sold for
26 off-premises consumption.

1 Section 2. (a) This act shall apply to the
2 regulation of the sale and distribution of alcoholic beverages
3 in the City of Millbrook and the City of Wetumpka in Elmore
4 County.

5 (b) The provisions of this act are cumulative and
6 supplemental to the present power and authority of the City of
7 Millbrook and the City of Wetumpka, respectively, and are not
8 intended to, nor shall they be interpreted so as to repeal any
9 existing power or authority of the City of Millbrook and the
10 City of Wetumpka now permitted under the general laws of the
11 state, or under any local or special act of the Legislature.

12 Section 3. For the purposes of this act, the term
13 "licensee of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board" shall not
14 include an Alcoholic Beverage Control Board licensee who
15 offers, allows, or conducts either of the following:

16 (1) Gambling as defined in Section 13A-12-20, Code
17 of Alabama 1975.

18 (2) Class II or Class III gaming as defined in 25
19 U.S.C. §2703.

20 Section 4. This act shall become effective
21 immediately following its passage and approval by the
22 Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
