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17	To amend Section 29-2-250 of the Code of Alabama
18	1975, relating to the Alabama Commission to Reduce Poverty, to
19	further provide for membership.
20	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
21	Section 1. Section 29-2-250 of the Code of Alabama
22	1975, is amended to read as follows:
23	"§29-2-250.
24	"(a) There is created the Alabama Commission to
25	Reduce Poverty. The commission shall consist of the chair and
26	vice chair of the House Education Appropriations Committee or
27	their designees; the chair and vice chair of the House

1 Government Appropriations Committee or their designees; the 2 chair and vice chair of the Senate Finance and Taxation Education Committee or their designees; the chair and vice 3 chair of the Senate Finance and Taxation General Fund Committee or their designees; three members of the House of 5 6 Representatives appointed by the Speaker; three members of the 7 Senate appointed by the Lieutenant Governor; one member appointed by the Alabama Poverty Project; one member appointed 8 9 by Alabama Arise; one member appointed by Alabama Community 10 Action Agencies; one member representing the faith community 11 appointed by the Governor; one member appointed by the Low 12 Income Housing Coalition; two individuals living in poverty 13 appointed by the Governor; and one member appointed by VOICES, 14 one member appointed by the Alabama Alliance to End Homelessness; one member appointed by the Business Council of 15 Alabama; one member appointed by the American Association of 16 17 Retired Persons (AARP); one member appointed by the Alabama Affiliate of Habitat for Humanity; and one member appointed by 18 the Alabama Industrial Development Training Institute (AIDT). 19 The membership of the commission shall be inclusive and 20 21 reflect the racial, gender, geographic, urban/rural, and 22 economic diversity of the state. The commission shall hold its 23 organizational meeting within 30 days after May 21, 2009. The 24 commission shall meet at the call of the chair or any majority 25 of members thereof; provided, that the commission shall meet at least once each four months. The commission may meet, act, 26 27 and conduct its business during the sessions of the

Legislature or any recess thereof, and in the interim period between sessions.

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- "(b) The Secretary of the Senate, the Clerk of the House of Representatives, the Legislative Reference Service, the Legislative Fiscal Office, and the Examiners of Public Accounts shall provide any assistance as may be necessary at the commission's request. Each legislative member of the commission shall be entitled to his or her regular legislative compensation, his or her per diem, and travel expenses for each day he or she attends a meeting of the commission which shall be paid out of any funds appropriated for the use of the Legislature, upon warrants drawn on the state Comptroller upon requisitions signed by the commission's chair; provided, however, that members shall not receive additional legislative compensation or per diem when the Legislature is in session but they shall receive their travel expenses for all meetings attended. Nonlegislative members shall receive per diem and travel expenses in the same amount as state employees receive, which amounts shall be paid out of funds appropriated by the Legislature for such use.
- "(c) The commission shall study and evaluate the following policies and programs of the State of Alabama:
- "(1) State supported programs that serve those living in poverty.
- "(2) The economic impact of poverty.
- "(3) Current policies and services that affect those living in poverty.

1	"(4) Recommendations and proposed legislation
2	affecting individuals in poverty.
3	"(d) The commission shall make an annual report to
4	members of the Legislature no later than the seventh
5	legislative day of each regular session detailing any and all
6	recommendations.
7	"(e) The amount of five thousand dollars (\$5,000)
8	shall be the total amount that may be expended by the
9	commission in any one year."
10	Section 2. This act shall become effective on the
11	first day of the third month following its passage and

approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.

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
