Section 1. Section 13A-11-74, Code of Alabama 1975,
is amended to read as follows:

"§13A-11-74.

7 "The provisions of Section 13A-11-73 shall not apply to marshals, sheriffs, prison and jail wardens and their 8 regularly employed deputies, policemen and other law 9 10 enforcement officers of any state or political subdivision thereof, or to the members of the army, navy or marine corps 11 12 of the United States or of the national guard, or to the 13 members of the national guard organized reserves or state 14 quard organizations when on duty or going to or from duty, or to the regularly enrolled members of any organization duly 15 authorized to purchase or receive such weapons from the United 16 17 States or from this state; provided, that such members are at or are going to or from their places of assembly or target 18 practices, or to officers or employees of the United States 19 duly authorized to carry a pistol, or to any person engaged in 20 21 manufacturing, repairing or dealing in pistols, or the agent 22 or representative of such person possessing, using, or 23 carrying a pistol in the usual or ordinary course of such business, or to any common carrier, except taxicabs, licensed 24 25 as a common carrier, or to any person permitted by law to 26 possess a pistol while carrying it unloaded in a secure 27 wrapper, from the place of purchase to his home or place of

business, or to or from a place of repair or in moving from 1 2 one place of abode or business to another, or to any person 3 permitted by law to possess a pistol who transports a pistol to and from an established shooting range for the purpose of 4 practicing shooting at targets, provided that the pistol is 5 unloaded and secured in the trunk of the vehicle during 6 7 transport, or in a motor vehicle without a trunk, the pistol is secured in a locked container outside of the passenger area 8 of the vehicle." 9

10 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the 11 first day of the third month following its passage and 12 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
