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18	To amend Sections 11-46-28 and 17-9-50, Code of
19	Alabama 1975, relating to proximity of persons other than
20	voters and election officials to polling places, to increase
21	the prohibited distance to 150 feet.
22	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
23	Section 1. Sections 11-46-28 and 17-9-50, Code of
24	Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows:
25	"§11-46-28.
26	"(a) Every polling place shall open for voting at
27	7:00 A.M. and shall close at 7:00 P.M. and shall remain open

for voting for not less than 12 consecutive hours. All polling places in areas operating on eastern time may open and close under this section pursuant to eastern time.

4 "The election officers at voting places shall meet at the respective places of holding elections for which they 5 6 have been appointed 30 minutes before the hour established by 7 the municipal governing body to open the polls and shall at the designated hour open the several polling places as 8 designated and keep them open without adjournment or recess 9 10 until the hour established by the municipal governing body to close the polls and no longer. 11

12 "(b) Any qualified elector entitled to vote at a 13 polling place who has identified himself or herself with the 14 election officials at the polling place by closing time shall 15 be permitted to cast his or her ballot.

16 "(c) Before entering upon their duties, the election 17 officers must take an oath to perform their duties at the 18 election according to law, and the oath may be administered 19 either by any person authorized by law to administer oaths or 20 by an election inspector.

"(d) When paper ballots are used, the inspectors shall select one of their number, on opening the polls, to act as challenger, and the challenger shall ascertain if each person presenting himself or herself to vote is registered, the finding to be from an examination of the official list of the voters furnished by the mayor or other chief executive officer.

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1 "(e) Upon receipt of the list showing the names of 2 every person whose name appears on the official list of qualified electors for that particular polling place who have 3 4 applied for absentee ballots in the election, the election officials shall strike from the list of qualified electors 5 6 kept at the polling place the name of every person who has 7 applied for an absentee ballot, and no person who has applied for an absentee ballot shall vote again. 8

9 "(f) Before the election officials commence 10 receiving ballots, the election inspectors must cause it to be 11 proclaimed aloud at the places of voting that the election is 12 opened.

"(g) After the polls have been opened, no adjournment or recess shall be taken until the certificate of the result of the election is signed.

16 "(h) When voting machines are used, the election 17 officials shall also comply with Section 11-46-47, and upon 18 completing the duties thereby imposed shall formally declare 19 the polls opened.

"(i) The marshal, chief of police, or other chief law enforcement officer of the city or town shall preserve good order at all municipal elections held in the city or town, but not more than one officer shall at the same time be allowed to enter the polling place. Except as electors are admitted to vote and persons to assist them as provided in this article and except the above-mentioned law enforcement

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officers, the election officials, and the watchers, no person
shall be permitted within <del>30</del> <u>150</u> feet of the polling place.

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"§17-9-50.

4 "Except as electors are admitted to vote and persons 5 to assist them as herein provided, and except for the judge of 6 probate, the sheriff, or his or her deputy, the precinct 7 election officials, and watchers, no person shall be permitted 8 within <del>30</del> <u>150</u> feet of the door of the building of the polling 9 place."

10 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the 11 first day of the third month following its passage and 12 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
