23	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
24	Section 1. The monies in Section 2 are appropriated
25	from the named funds for the 2013-2014 fiscal year to the
26	state agencies indicated, as the amounts to be used to pay the
27	expenditures of the named agencies, and are in lieu of all

monies appropriated for these purposes in other sections of
 the Alabama Statutes.

For the purpose of this act, the amounts herein for expenditures are listed by programmatic area and the totals for all programs are shown by the source of funds. It is intended that only the herein named funds be appropriated in the amounts specified to the named agencies and that the following definitions shall be applicable.

9 "Appropriation Total" shall mean the aggregate total 10 of all fund sources.

"Program" shall mean specific governmental services required to achieve a specific objective. A program shall be directed to meeting the need of an identified clientele, or group of recipients or beneficiaries, and shall be expended only for such purposes.

16 "Capital Outlay" shall mean expenditures which 17 result in the acquisition and/or addition to items, such as 18 land or buildings, which have an appreciable and calculable 19 period of usefulness in excess of one year, and shall be 20 expended only for such purposes.

"Debt Service" shall mean an expenditure for the payment of interest and principal on bonded debt obligations of the State, and shall be expended only for such purposes.

24 "Federal and Local Funds" shall mean all gifts,
25 grants, contributions, or entitlements, including grants by
26 the Congress of the United States, municipalities or counties.

1 Section 2. There is hereby appropriated 2 the amounts set forth herein for the ordinary expenses of the executive, legislative, and judicial agencies of the State, 3 for other functions of government, for debt service, and for 4 capital outlay for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2014, 5 6 to be paid out of any monies hereinafter specified, from such 7 other funds and accounts as may be designated, or so much thereof as may be necessary, and the total amount to be ex-8 pended for the items for which the appropriation is herein 9 10 made shall not exceed the amount provided therefor, except as provided in the Budget Management Act of 1976, Sections 11 12 41-19-1 through 41-19-12, Code of Alabama 1975. Provided, how-13 ever, that regardless of the ending date of any pay period 14 which has been or may be established by the Legislature for 15 the payment of salaries of state employees, the entire payment due shall be made from the fiscal year's appropriation in 16 17 which the pay date falls.

In addition to the above appropriation herein made, there is hereby appropriated for each additional retail and wholesale store put into operation during the fiscal year, an amount equal to the sum required to install and operate a comparable store in operation by said Board. There is further appropriated to the Alabama Alcoholic Beverage Control Board, after provision has been made for the other expenditures herein authorized, such sums as are or may be necessary to purchase the alcoholic beverages which are essential to maintain adequate stocks and inventory for an economic and successful sales operation. In addition to the above appropriation, it is further provided that, in the event any county or municipality of the state shall, during the fiscal period covered by this appropriation by proper referendum, authorize the legal sale of malt and brewed beverages within such county or municipality there is further appropriated, in addition to the amount herein set out, an amount comparable to that expended during the prior fiscal year for beer and license tax supervision within counties or municipalities of similar size and population. 17 Section 3. Notwithstanding any other provisions of 18 this act or any other act, any amounts from appropriations for 19 the fiscal year ending September 30, 2013, to the various 20 state agencies in this act which were unexpended and reverted 21 on September 30, 2013, are hereby reappropriated to the 22 respective offices for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 23 2013.

Section 4. In addition to all other appropriations heretofore or hereafter made, there is hereby appropriated such amounts as may be necessary for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2014, to the Retirement Systems of Alabama from the Senior Services Trust Fund to comply with Section
 41-15C-1, Code of Alabama 1975.

Section 5. In addition to all other appropriations 3 4 heretofore or hereafter made, there is hereby conditionally appropriated any and all amounts from tobacco settlement or 5 6 litigation for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2014. The 7 amounts are conditioned upon the State of Alabama receiving revenue from tobacco settlement or litigation and upon the 8 recommendation of the Director of Finance, the Chairs of the 9 10 House Ways and Means General Fund Committee, the Senate 11 Finance and Taxation-General Fund Committee, and the approval 12 of the Governor. The conditional appropriation made herein 13 shall be allocated pursuant to Sections 41-10-620 through 14 41-10-639 and Sections 41-15B-1 through 41-15B-6, Code of 15 Alabama 1975.

Section 6. Except as may be herein otherwise 16 17 provided, amounts herein specifically appropriated shall be in lieu of the amounts heretofore provided or appropriated by law 18 for such purposes. The amounts herein appropriated are the 19 20 maximum amounts to be expended for the purposes herein 21 designated and in no event shall the maximum expenditure 22 provided for any items of expense exceed the amount allocated 23 herein except as may be provided for under Sections 3, 4, 5, 24 7, 8, and 11 of this bill, as provided in the Budget Management Act of 1976, Sections 41-19-1 et seq., Code of 25 Alabama 1975, and those appropriations herein made, except 26 27 appropriations to the Alabama Alcoholic Beverage Control Board

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for the purchase of alcoholic beverages, are and shall be subject to the terms, conditions, provisions and limitations of Sections 41-4-80 et seq., Code of Alabama 1975, and the Budget Management Act of 1976, Sections 41-19-1 et seq., Code of Alabama 1975.

Section 7. Any surplus remaining in any 6 7 appropriation herein made from the State General Fund to any office, department, bureau, board, commission or agency may be 8 transferred, on order of the Governor, to any other 9 10 appropriation herein made from the State General Fund when such appropriation to any office, department, bureau, board, 11 12 commission or agency is insufficient to pay salaries in that 13 office, department, bureau, board, commission or agency.

14 Section 8. In addition to appropriations herein 15 made, all gifts, grants, insurance proceeds, contributions or entitlements, in excess of the amount carried in the bill, 16 17 including grants by the Congress of the United States, municipalities or counties, to any department, division, 18 board, bureau, commission, agency, institution, office or 19 20 officer of the State of Alabama are hereby appropriated and, 21 in the event the same are recurring, are reappropriated to 22 such department, division, board, bureau, commission, agency, 23 institution, office or officer to be used only for the purpose 24 or purposes for which the grant or contribution was or shall be made. Further, all state, county, municipal and educational 25 26 entities are authorized to disburse such sums as deemed 27 necessary by mutual agreement between said entities and the

State of Alabama, Department of Examiners of Public Accounts to partially defray the cost of auditing services performed by said agency. All such sums are hereby appropriated and reappropriated if necessary to the Department of Examiners of Public Accounts for audit services, to be expended through the fund established by Section 41-5-24, Code of Alabama 1975.

7 Section 9. Upon certification to the Director of Finance by the State Attorney General that a federal court has 8 ordered the State of Alabama to pay claims, attorney fees, or 9 10 other costs relating to said court order, funds are hereby appropriated to the affected department, board, bureau, or 11 12 commission from the appropriate fund or funds of such 13 department, board, bureau or commission in the amount 14 necessary to satisfy that court order. Such appropriations are 15 in addition to any other appropriation heretofore or hereafter made in this appropriation act. Such appropriations are 16 17 conditioned upon the availability of funds and a determination by the Director of Finance that existing appropriations are 18 not available for the court-ordered payments. 19

Section 10. All interest earned from funds paid into Account No. 0396 by Act 87-761, Act 88-947, Act 89-79, Act 90-556 and Act 91-572 are hereby appropriated to the Governor's Contingency Fund to be spent at the discretion of the Governor. Any other interest earned by the state from Revenue Sharing Investments under the State and Local Fiscal Assistance Act of 1972, as amended, Public Law 92-512, 92nd Congress, together with any accruals or reversions thereon are
 hereby appropriated to the State General Fund.

Section 11. All encumbered balances of a previous 3 4 fiscal year appropriation, other than the exclusions authorized by this Act or in Section 41-4-93, Code of Alabama 5 6 1975, shall lapse no later than September 30 of the fiscal 7 year immediately following the fiscal year for which the appropriation was made and shall revert to the credit of the 8 State General Fund or earmarked fund from which the 9 10 appropriation or appropriations were made.

11 Section 12. The appropriations made herein to the 12 departments, boards, offices, commissions and agencies include 13 the amounts necessary and said departments, boards, offices, 14 commissions and agencies are hereby directed to make the 15 transfer of funds to the State Personnel Department in said amounts enumerated in this act. All agencies enumerated in 16 17 this act and receiving services from other governmental agencies enumerated in this act shall make full payment in a 18 19 timely manner (as determined by the Department of Finance) for such services. 20

21 Section 13. All funds collected under Section 22 40-12-43.1 between the effective date of Act 98-191 and 23 September 30, 2013 are hereby appropriated to the Auburn 24 University Center for Governmental Services for the 25 administration of the examiner certification program 26 established by the Alabama Local Tax Institute of Standards 27 and Training as provided in Section 40-12-43.1. 1 Section 14. It is the intent of the Legislature that 2 the funds appropriated to the Office of the Senate President Pro Tempore in subsection 9 of Section 2A of this act which 3 4 are not otherwise designated may be expended by the Senate President Pro Tempore for the same purposes as are authorized 5 6 for the Lieutenant Governor pursuant to Section 29-4-50 Code 7 of Alabama 1975, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives pursuant to Section 29-4-60 Code of Alabama 8 1975. 9

10 Section 15. If merit pay increases are reinstated 11 after December 31, 2013, current anniversary dates will be 12 maintained for all state employees. Agencies are prohibited 13 from adjusting employee anniversary dates to obtain merit pay 14 increases at an earlier date.

15 Section 16. The appropriations made herein to the departments, boards, offices, commissions and agencies include 16 17 the amounts necessary to pay the State Employee Health Insurance Board (SEIB). The SEIB rate shall be \$800 per month 18 for each full-time employee for the fiscal year ending 19 September 30, 2014. The State Employees' Insurance Board will 20 21 adjust the insurance program wherever appropriate to maintain 22 the aforementioned fixed rate.

23 Section 17. It is the intent of the Legislature that 24 the Director of Finance shall notify the Chair of the House 25 Ways and Means General Fund Committee, the Chair of the Senate 26 Finance and Taxation-General Fund Committee, and the 27 Legislative Fiscal Officer of any interagency transfers, of any type, including contracting, of any of the funds
 appropriated in this act.

3 Section 18. If any section, paragraph, sentence,
4 clause, provision or portion of this act or all or any portion
5 of any appropriations herein made be held unconstitutional or
6 invalid, it shall not affect any other section, paragraph,
7 sentence, clause, provision or portion of this act or any
8 other appropriation or appropriations or portion thereof
9 hereby made not in and of itself unconstitutional or invalid.

10 Section 19. All laws or parts of laws, general, 11 special, private or local that are in conflict with or 12 inconsistent with the provisions of this act are hereby 13 expressly repealed.

14 Section 20. Each agency of the State funded through 15 the provisions of this act shall provide an equal opportunity 16 for employment and business opportunities for all citizens of 17 this state without regard to sex or race.

18 Section 21. This act shall become effective October19 1, 2013.

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
