13	list be published online on or before the 20th day preceding

15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
16	Section 1. Section 17-3-50, Code of Alabama 1975, is
17	amended to read as follows: Sections 17-3-50 and 17-4-33, Code
18	of Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows:
19	"§17-3-50.
20	"(a) The boards of registrars in the several
21	counties of the state shall not register any person as a
22	qualified elector within $\frac{10}{17}$ days prior to any election;
23	provided, that the boards shall maintain open offices during
24	business days in such 10-day <u>17-day</u> period and on election day
25	during the hours of voting.
26	"(b) The provisions of this section shall not apply
27	in any county having a population of not less than 600,000

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inhabitants according to the 1970 or any succeeding federal decennial census, and any currently effective local law or general law of local application providing for a deadline on registration in such county shall remain in full force and effect and shall not be repealed by operation of this section."

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<u>"§17-4-33.</u>

"The State of Alabama shall provide, through the 8 Secretary of State, a nondiscriminatory, single, uniform, 9 10 official, centralized, interactive computerized statewide voter registration list defined, maintained, and administered 11 12 by the Secretary of State, with advice from the Voter Registration Advisory Board and the President of the Alabama 13 14 Probate Judges Association, which contains the name and registration information of every legally registered voter in 15 the state. The computerized list shall comply with the 16 17 following requirements: "(1) It shall serve as the single system for storing 18 and managing the official list of registered voters throughout 19 the state, and it shall be published on or before the 20th day 20 prior to any general, primary, or special election. 21 22 "(2) It shall contain the name, address, and voting 23 location, as well as other information deemed necessary by the

24 <u>Voter Registration Advisory Board or the Secretary of State</u>,

25 <u>of every legally registered voter in the state.</u>

26 <u>"(3) A unique identifier shall be assigned to each</u>
27 <u>legally registered voter in the state.</u>

1	"(4) It shall contain the voting history of each
2	registered voter.
3	"(5) It shall be coordinated with the driver's
4	license database of the Department of Public Safety and the
5	appropriate state agency to assist in the removal of deceased
6	voters.
7	"(6) Any election official in the state, including
8	any local election official, may obtain immediate electronic
9	access to the information contained in the computerized list.
10	"(7) All voter registration information obtained by
11	any registrar in the state shall be electronically entered
12	into the computerized list on an expedited basis at the time
13	information is provided to the registrar.
14	"(8) The Secretary of State shall provide such
15	support as may be required so that registrars are able to
16	enter voter registration information.
17	"(9) It shall serve as the official voter
18	registration list for the conduct of all elections.
19	"(10) Following each state and county election, the
20	Secretary of State shall provide one electronic copy of the
21	computerized voter list free of charge to each political party
22	that satisfied the ballot access requirements for that
23	election. The electronic copy of the computerized voter list
24	shall be provided within 30 days of the certification of the
25	election or upon the completion of the election vote history
26	update following the election, whichever comes first. In
27	addition, upon written request from the chair of a political

1	party, the Secretary of State shall furnish up to two
2	additional electronic copies of the computerized voter file
3	during each calendar year to each political party that
4	satisfied the ballot access requirements during the last
5	statewide election held prior to that calendar year. The
6	electronic copies provided pursuant to this section shall
7	contain the full, editable data as it exists in the
8	computerized voter list maintained by the Secretary of State."
9	Section 2. This act shall become effective on the
10	first day of the third month following its passage and
11	approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
