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22	To establish the School Resource Officers' Act; to
23	provide for the funding necessary to hire, train and equip
24	school resource officers for every public school in
25	participating school systems; to provide for the requirements,
26	duties and responsibilities of a school resource officer; and

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1 to require the State Department of Education to implement and 2 administer the provisions of this act.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

4 Section 1. (a) This section shall be known and may 5 be cited as the School Resource Officers' Act of 2013.

6 Section 2. (a) When used in this chapter, the 7 following terms shall have the following meanings:

8 (1) PROGRAM. The School Resource Officers' Program
9 as provided in Section 4.

10 (2) SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER. A law enforcement
 11 officer as defined in Section 36-21-40 who is employed by a
 12 public school system of the state.

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(3) SCHOOL. Any county or city public school.

14 (4) SCHOOL SYSTEM. Any county or city public school
15 system, the Alabama Institute for Deaf and Blind, the Alabama
16 School of Fine Arts, the Alabama High School of Mathematics
17 and Science, and the Department of Youth Services School
18 District.

Section 3. The Legislature finds that a need exists 19 within the state to further ensure that all public K-12 20 21 schools remain safe, secure and effective places of learning. 22 The Legislature further finds that ensuring safe, secure and 23 effective places of learning is best achieved with the help of 24 school safety partners. Therefore, it is the intent of the 25 Legislature to promote and support the placement of school 26 resource officers in every public K-12 school and that

placement of the resource officers be implemented and
 partially funded in legislation.

Section 4. (a) There is hereby established the 3 4 School Resource Officers' Program. The primary purpose of this program is to make available one-half of the funding that is 5 necessary to place school resource officers in public schools. 6 7 Each school in the program within a participating school system shall receive an appropriation equal to one-half of the 8 average school resource officer's salary plus benefits 9 10 annually. The remaining one-half of the necessary funding 11 shall be provided by the local school system which employs the 12 school resource officer.

13 Section 5. (a) School Resource Officers. Local law 14 enforcement officers assigned to or employed by local school 15 systems must meet all state and federal requirements to be a resource officer, including meeting mandatory policy and 16 17 procedural testing requirements, background checks and periodic health and weapons exams. School resource officers 18 shall also be required to attend continuing education courses 19 and training sessions. 20

(b) A contract or memorandum of understanding entered into under subsection (a) must state the nature and scope of a school resource officer's duties and responsibilities, including the following:

(1) The promotion of a safe and orderly school
environment through the reduction of rule violations and crime
within the school and on school property.

(2) Supporting school personnel in efforts to
 provide a safe, productive learning environment, including
 enforcement of school rules and administration of school
 disciplinary policies.

5 (3) Assisting the local school system in the
6 implementation of an emergency prepardness plan or a crisis
7 intervention plan.

8 (4) Acting as a liaison between the local school
9 system and local law enforcement agencies.

(5) Assisting school personnel in detecting and
 addressing instances of bullying, intimidation, harassment and
 other types of threats to student safety, learning and
 development.

14 Section 6. The State Department of Education shall 15 lead, implement, provide oversight and administer this act and 16 shall adopt such rules as are necessary in accordance with an 17 implementation plan.

18 Section 7. Passage and approval of this act is 19 contingent upon passage of a proposed Constitutional Amendment 20 creating an Alabama Lottery Corporation with the net proceeds 21 from the lottery dedicated to the Education Trust Fund for 22 classroom instructional supplies, school resource officers and 23 scholarships.

24 Section 8. This act shall become effective on the 25 first day of the third month following its passage and 26 approval by the Governor, or by its otherwise becoming law.

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
