27	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

1 Section 1. The following amendment to the 2 Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, is proposed and shall become valid as a part thereof when approved by a 3 4 majority of the qualified electors voting thereon and in accordance with Sections 284, 285, and 287 of the Constitution 5 of Alabama of 1901, as amended: 6 7 PROPOSED AMENDMENT (a) Amendment 225 of the Constitution of Alabama of 8 1901, now appearing as Section 211.04 of the Official 9 10 Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, is repealed. 11 12 (b) Beginning September 1, 2013, the sale of food 13 and over-the-counter drugs shall be exempt from the state 14 sales tax. Local governments shall continue to collect sales taxes on food and over-the-counter drugs at the same rate 15 collected for the local portion of the retail sales tax. For 16 17 purposes of this amendment, food means food as defined in 7 U.S.C. §2011, et seq., for the purposes of the federal 18 Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program regardless of where 19

or by what means food is sold. In the event that the federal Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program definition no longer exists, the Legislature shall provide a new definition of food by general law.

Over-the-counter drugs means drugs that are sold without a prescription and that contain a label that identifies the product as a drug as required by 21 C.F.R. \$201.66. The over-the-counter drug label includes a drug facts

panel or a list of the active ingredients with a list of those ingredients contained in the compound, substance or preparation. Over-the-counter drugs do not include grooming and hygiene products, including soaps and cleaning solutions, shampoo, toothpaste, mouthwash, antiperspirants, and sun tan lotions and screens, regardless of whether the product meets the definition of over-the-counter drugs.

8 Section 2. An election upon the proposed amendment 9 shall be held in accordance with Sections 284 and 285 of the 10 Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, and the election 11 laws of this state at the next statewide primary, general or 12 special election held for that purpose.

13 Section 3. The appropriate election official shall 14 assign a ballot number for the proposed constitutional 15 amendment on the election ballot and shall set forth the 16 following description of the substance or subject matter of 17 the proposed constitutional amendment:

18 "Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of 19 Alabama of 1901, to repeal Amendment 225 of the Constitution 20 of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Section 211.04 of the 21 Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, 22 as amended; and to exempt sales of food and over-the-counter 23 drugs from state sales tax.
