This bill would provide for an additional 14 fee of \$5 for each firefighter tag to be 15 distributed to the Fire Fighters Annuity and 16 17 Benefit Fund. 18 19 A BILL 20 TO BE ENTITLED 21 AN ACT 22 Relating to firefighter distinctive motor vehicle 23 24 tags; to amend Section 32-6-272 of the Code of Alabama 1975, to provide an additional fee for firefighter tags to be 25 26 distributed to the Fire Fighters Annuity and Benefit Fund. 27 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. Section 32-6-272 of the Code of Alabama
 1975, is amended to read as follows:

"§32-6-272.

4 "(a) The distinctive license plates here provided
5 for shall be prepared by the Commissioner of Revenue and shall
6 be issued through the judge of probate, license commissioner,
7 or other license issuing official of the several counties of
8 the state in like manner as are other motor vehicle license
9 plates or tags and such officers shall be entitled to their
10 regular fees for such service.

11 "(b) The Alabama Forestry Commission shall prepare a 12 list of all members of certified volunteer fire departments and the Firefighters' Personnel Standards and Education 13 14 Commission shall prepare a list of all members of paid or part-paid fire departments. The Forestry Commission and the 15 Firefighters' Personnel Standards and Education Commission 16 17 shall submit to the judge of probate, license commissioner, or other license issuing official of each county by December 1 of 18 each year the lists of members of fire departments. 19

"(c) (1) An applicant for a distinctive plate shall 20 21 present to the issuing official proof of his or her 22 identification, and the firefighter shall be issued the 23 requested number of distinctive license plates or tags upon the payment of the regular license fee for tags, as provided 24 25 by law, but shall not be required to pay the three dollar (\$3) 26 fee. The distinctive license plates or tags so issued shall be 27 used only upon and for personally-owned, private, passenger

vehicles, to include station wagons and pick-up trucks, registered in the name of the firefighter making application therefor, and when so issued to the applicant shall be used upon the vehicle for which issued in lieu of the standard license plates or license tags normally issued for such vehicle.

7 "(2) In addition to any fee provided by law, an applicant for a firefighter tag issued pursuant to this 8 section shall pay an annual additional fee of five dollars 9 10 (\$5) for each tag. The funds upon collection shall be forwarded to the State Treasurer in the same manner as other 11 12 motor vehicle license fees and shall be distributed to the Fire Fighters Annuity and Benefit Fund to be used for the 13 14 purposes of the fund.

15 "(d) Any person who joins a volunteer, paid, or part-paid fire department after December 1 of any year or any 16 17 person who is mistakenly omitted from the lists prepared as described above may obtain a distinctive plate by presenting 18 to the license issuing official proof of his or her membership 19 in a fire department by means of a certificate signed by the 20 21 chief of the department on a form prescribed by the Alabama 22 Forestry Commission.

"(e) Anyone who is proven to have either falsely obtained or certified an individual to obtain a distinctive firefighter license plate shall be guilty of a Class C misdemeanor, and upon conviction, shall be punished according to law. "(f) A distinctive license plate shall be provided, upon written request, to a widow or widower of either of a paid, part-paid, or a volunteer firefighter who dies in the line of duty. For purposes of this subsection, a death in the line of duty is determined by a circumstance in which a municipal firefighter's death would result in a death benefit under Section 11-43-144."

8 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the 9 first day of the third month following its passage and 10 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
