| 18 | BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA: |
| 19 | Section 1. This act shall be known and cited as the |
| 20 | "Alabama Animal Shelter Reporting Act." |
| 21 | Section 2. For purposes of this act, the following |
| 22 | words shall have the following meanings: |
| 23 | (1) ANIMAL SHELTER. Any facility operated in whole |
| 24 | or in part by any municipality, county government, or any duly |
| 25 | incorporated humane society that receives public funds to |
| 26 | impound or harbor seized, stray, homeless, abandoned, or |

- unwanted dogs, cats, or other pets or for the protection of
 animals to prevent cruelty or neglect.
- 3 (2) PUBLISH. To make available through either4 electronic means or on paper.

5 Section 3. On an annual basis, each animal shelter 6 owner, operator, manager, or director shall report the 7 following information:

- 8 (1) The number of animals of each species taken in 9 from the following sources:
- 10 a. Owner surrenders.
- 11 b. Strays.
- 12 c. Other animal shelters.
- 13 d. Animal control.
- 14 e. Other.
- 15 (2) The number of animals which have been:
- 16 a. Adopted.
- b. Released to or claimed by the owner or owners.

c. Transferred to other animal shelter facilities or
 released to animal rescue organizations and a list of the
 names of the receiving organizations.

d. Euthanized or have died while in the custody ofthe animal shelter.

e. Transferred to a research laboratory, school,
college, university, or agency that supplies animals to these
facilities.

26 f. Found to be sterilized upon arrival at the animal 27 shelter when it can be determined. 1

g. Sterilized after arrival.

(3) The costs incurred by the animal shelter for
housing, maintenance, feeding, medications, transfer,
euthanasia, and other expenses related to the care of the
animals and their disposition, excluding salary and benefits
paid to employees.

7 Section 4. (a) Each animal shelter shall report the information required in Section 3 no later than 90 days after 8 9 the end of each calendar year. Each animal shelter shall make 10 the report available to the public. The animal shelter may compile, publish, computerize, and enter the data or 11 12 information in Section 3 in a form which is compatible with 13 any system utilized by the animal shelter as long as the information in Section 3 is all-inclusive and is reflected in 14 15 the report.

(b) The animal shelter may charge a reasonable fee
for a copy of the report. Each animal shelter shall maintain
the annual reports for a minimum of four years.

(c) Reports under this act shall be considered 19 20 government documents and public record and access to the 21 reports shall not be denied pursuant to any exemption under 22 The Freedom of Information Act. The report compiled by the 23 owner, operator, manager, or director of each animal shelter 24 shall include a statement that the author of the report 25 certifies it is true and correct to the best of his or her 26 knowledge.

1 Section 5. Any person who is required under this act 2 to file a report and intentionally and knowingly fails to file 3 the report or knowingly makes, compiles, or publishes a 4 fraudulent report is guilty of a Class B misdemeanor.

Section 6. Although this bill would have as its 5 purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased 6 7 expenditure of local funds, the bill is excluded from further requirements and application under Amendment 621, now 8 appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of 9 10 the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, because the 11 bill defines a new crime or amends the definition of an 12 existing crime.

Section 7. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
