- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

- Section 1. For purposes of this act, the following terms shall have the following meanings:
  - (1) ECONOMIC INCENTIVE. Benefits provided to a recipient for locating, enlarging, expanding, or otherwise taking similar favorable action within the state. Economic incentives may include, but are not limited to, the following: Public funds; public financed employee training, assistance with site preparation, or highway improvement; tax abatements; or other state resources or improvements.
  - (2) FULL-TIME JOB. A job in which an individual is employed by a recipient for at least 35 hours per week.
  - (3) PART-TIME JOB. A job in which an individual is employed by a recipient for less than 35 hours per week.
  - (4) RECIPIENT. Any business, entity, or individual receiving, either directly or indirectly, the benefits of an economic incentive.
  - (5) TEMPORARY JOB. A job in which an individual is hired for a limited period of time.

Section 2. No later than the fifth legislative day of each regular session of the Legislature beginning in 2014 and continuing annually thereafter, the Executive Branch shall submit a report to the members of the Alabama Legislature for the fiscal year ending prior to that regular session
