14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:		
15	Section 1. (a) Upon the effective date of this act,		
16	the Medicaid Joint Interim Committee and the Permanent Joint		
17	Legislative Committee on Medicaid Policy are hereby abolished		
18	and the Permanent Joint Medicaid Committee is established as		
19	provided herein.		
20	(b) The membership of the Committee shall consist of		
21	the current chair and co-chair of the Permanent Joint		
22	Legislative Committee on Medicaid Policy, the Chair of the		
23	House Committee on Health, the Chair of the House Ways and		
24	Means General Fund Committee, the Chair of the Senate		
25	Committee on Health, the Chair of the Senate Committee on		
26	Finance and Taxation and General Fund, three members of the		

House appointed by the Speaker of the House of

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Representatives, one member of the Senate appointed by the Lieutenant Governor, and two members of the Senate appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate. The membership of this committee shall be inclusive and reflect the racial, gender, geographic, urban/rural, and economic diversity of the state.

- (c) The initial meeting of the committee shall occur no later than 30 days following the effective date of this act at a date and time established by the Speaker of the House of Representatives, at which time the committee shall elect a chair and a vice-chair from its membership. Thereafter the meetings shall be at the call of the chair or by any majority of the members thereof.
- (d) The committee shall make a continuous study of the Alabama Medicaid Program and make recommendations for legislation and initiatives that will create the necessary statutory, regulatory, and institutional changes to accomplish the overall goals and objectives of the Alabama Medicaid Agency in a manner that benefits the State and protects Medicaid recipients. The committee may also engage existing universities in the State of Alabama for support and research activities as they pertain to the Alabama Medicaid Agency and changes needed to the Medicaid State Plan.
- Section 2. The designed objectives of the committee are to achieve the following goals:
- (a) To keep the legislature informed about the expansion of existing programs and implementation of new

programs to meet the Alabama Medicaid Agency's current and future health care and funding needs by:

- (1) Encouraging effective strategies to avoid decreases in eligibility due to funding shortages;
 - (2) Promoting existing programs and new programs to realize cost savings to the Agency;
 - (3) Promoting existing programs within the Agency that have proven to provide cost effective high quality care.
 - (b) To keep the legislature informed about the development of Regional Care Networks throughout the state by:
 - (1) Encouraging the implementation of programs based upon proven best practices of coordinated care programs which have been implemented in other states' Medicaid programs.
 - (2) Monitoring the Alabama Medicaid Agency's timeline and goals for a successful implementation of Regional Care Networks throughout the state. The committee shall monitor the implementation of the Regional Care Networks and report to the Legislature at least quarterly on the status of the implementation.

Annual expenses and compensation of the committee shall not exceed \$5,000.

Section 3. There is created the Medicaid Advisory

Commission Council. The purpose of the commission council

shall be to advise the Joint Medicaid Committee on Medicaid

reform initiatives and the implementation of the Regional Care

Networks. The commission council shall consist of the Chair of

the Permanent Joint Medicaid Committee who shall serve as

chair, the vice-chair of the Permanent Joint Medicaid Committee, the State Health Officer, the Commissioner of the Alabama Medicaid Agency, the Commissioner of the Departments of Human Resources, Mental Health, and Senior Services or their designee, the Finance Director, or his or her designee, three physicians including two practicing physicians appointed by the Alabama Medical Association Medical Association of the State of Alabama, one practicing pediatrician appointed by the Alabama Chapter of the American Academy of Pediatrics, one member representing the Pharmaceutical Research Manufacturer's Association, one member representing for-profit insurers appointed by the Governor, one member representing not-for-profit insurers appointed by the Governor, one member representing consumers appointed by the Governor, one member representing the business community appointed by the Governor, one pharmacist appointed by the Alabama Pharmacy Association and one registered pharmacist currently engaged in retail pharmacy appointed by the Governor, one pharmacist appointed by the Alabama Pharmacy Association with a background in pharmacy services to long-term care facilities and one pharmacist appointed by the Alabama Pharmacy Cooperative, Inc., one member representing the home health industry appointed by the Governor, three members appointed by the Alabama Nursing Home Association, three members appointed by the Alabama Hospital Association, and one member appointed by the Alabama Hospice and Palliative Care Organization, and one member appointed by the Alabama Optometric Association. The

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membership of the Commission council shall be inclusive and reflect the racial, gender, geographic, urban/rural and economic diversity of the state.

Section 4. This act shall become effective immediately upon its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
