18	To amend Section 40-18-132, Code of Alabama 1975,
19	relating to state income tax credits for rural physicians; to
20	provide an increase in the state income tax credit awarded to
21	physicians who practice in rural communities.
22	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
23	Section 1. Section 40-18-132, Code of Alabama 1975,
24	is amended to read as follows:
25	<b>"</b> §40-18-132.
26	" <u>(a)</u> Beginning with the 1994 tax year, a person
27	qualifying as a rural physician shall be allowed a credit

against the tax imposed by Section 40-18-2, in the sum of \$5,000. No credit shall be allowed to a rural physician who is, on May 4, 1993, practicing in a small or rural community. No credit shall be allowed to a physician who has previously practiced in a small or rural community unless, after May 4, 1993, that physician returns to practice in a small or rural community after having practiced in a large or urban community for at least three years. The tax credit may be claimed for not more than five consecutive tax years.

"(b) Beginning with the 2014 tax year, a person who qualifies as a rural physician shall be allowed a credit against the tax imposed by Section 40-18-2 in the sum of six thousand dollars (\$6,000) for a period of six consecutive years. Beginning with the 2015 tax year, a person who qualifies shall be allowed a tax credit of seven thousand dollars (\$7,000) for a period of seven consecutive years.

Beginning with the 2016 tax year, a person who qualifies shall be allowed a tax credit of eight thousand dollars (\$8,000) for a period of eight consecutive years.

"(c) No person who qualifies shall be allowed to move from one qualifying year to the next progressive year. No credit shall be allowed to a physician who has previously practiced in a small or rural community unless he or she is previously qualified in this section and after the passage of the act adding this amendatory language returns to practice in a small or rural community after having practiced in a large or urban community for at least three years.

1	" <u>(d)</u> The Department of Revenue shall promulgate any
2	rules and regulations necessary to implement and administer
3	the provisions of this article."
4	Section 2. This act shall become effective
5	immediately following its passage and approval by the
6	Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
