24	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:		
25	Section 1. As used in this act, the following words		

shall have the following meanings:

(1) POOL ALARM. A device which emits a sound of at least 50 decibels when a person or an object weighing 15 pounds or more enters the water in a swimming pool, but shall not include, swimming protection alarm devices designed for individual use, such as an alarm attached to a child that sounds when the child exceeds a certain distance or becomes submerged in water.

- (2) RESIDENTIAL DWELLING. A one-family or two-family dwelling structure.
  - (3) SWIMMING POOL. A structure that is intended for swimming or recreational bathing and contains water over 36 inches deep including, but not limited to, in-ground, aboveground, and on-ground swimming pools; hot tubs; and nonportable spas which are located outside of the residential dwelling and are not attached in any way to the dwelling.

Section 2. (a) Each person, enterprise, agency, or entity that purchases or acquires a swimming pool to be installed after the effective date of this act is advise to encourage the owner of the swimming pool to install a pool alarm before using or making available for use such swimming pool.

(b) The seller of a swimming pool shall be exempt from civil liability if he or she did not advise the buyer of the pool to install a pool alarm.

Section 3. (a) Each pool alarm purchased for installation in a swimming pool shall be exempt from sales or

use taxes if the purchaser certifies that the alarm is purchased for installation in a residential dwelling.

(b) The forms shall be prepared by the Department of Revenue and the department shall promulgate and enforce rules concerning the filing of the forms and the verification of the exemption claimed by a person, enterprise, agency, or entity that sells swimming pools to the general public.

Section 4. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
