21	32-6-7.2, Code of Alabama 1975, to increase the minimum number
22	of hours of behind-the-wheel driving practice required for a

24	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
25	Section 1. Section 32-6-7.2, Code of Alabama 1975,
26	is amended to read as follows:
27	"\$32-6-7.2.

1 "(a) A person who is under the age of 18 may not 2 apply for a Stage II restricted regular driver's license until the person has held a Stage I learner's license issued 3 4 pursuant to Section 32-6-8 or a comparable license issued by another state for at least a six-month period. 5 6 "(b) In addition to any other requirements of this 7 chapter, if the applicant for a driver's license is 16 years of age, he or she shall submit to the Department of Public 8 Safety the following: 9 10 "(1) A verification form provided by the Department of Public Safety signed by a parent or legal guardian 11 12 consenting to the licensure of the applicant. 13 "(2) A verification form provided by the Department 14 of Public Safety signed by a parent, legal guardian, or licensed or certified driving instructor certifying that the 15 applicant has completed a minimum of 30 50 hours of 16 17 behind-the-wheel driving practice, or submission of a certificate of completion from the State Department of 18 Education that the applicant has passed a driver's education 19

"(c) A person who is issued a regular driver's license who is age 17 and has been licensed for less than six months or who is age 16 shall be deemed to have a Stage II restricted driver's license. The person may not operate a vehicle under any of the following conditions:

"(1) Between 12:00 o'clock midnight and 6:00 o'clock

"a. The licensee is accompanied by a parent or legal
 quardian.

3 "b. The licensee is accompanied by a person who is a
4 licensed driver and is at least 21 years of age or the consent
5 of a parent or legal guardian of the driver is given.

6 "c. The licensee is driving to or from a place where 7 the licensee is employed or works.

8 "d. The licensee is driving to or from a school9 sponsored event.

10 "e. The licensee is driving to or from an event11 sponsored by a religious organization.

12 "f. The licensee is driving for the purpose of a13 medical, fire, or law enforcement related emergency.

14 "g. The licensee is driving to or from a place where 15 the licensee participates in hunting or fishing activities. In 16 order for this particular exception to apply, the licensee 17 must have in his or her immediate possession a valid hunting 18 or fishing license for the activity.

19 "(2) If there is more than one passenger in the 20 vehicle not including the parents, legal guardians of the 21 licensee, accompanying family members, or a licensed driver 22 who is at least 21 years of age.

"(3) While operating any handheld communication
device that is nonessential to the functioning of the vehicle.

"(d) A violation of subsection (c) shall not result
in a suspension of the person's driver's license, but shall
extend the time period for six months that the person is

subject to the restrictions of subsection (c) before the
 person is eligible to be designated as an unrestricted
 driver's license holder or until age 18.

4 "(e) The driver's license of any person who is driving with restricted privileges as provided in subsection 5 6 (c) who during such time is convicted of a second moving 7 traffic violation or is convicted of failure to give information or render aid, racing, fleeing or attempting to 8 elude a law enforcement officer, reckless driving, illegal 9 10 passing, driving on the wrong side of the road, or any other offense where four or more points are assessed and other 11 12 violations as designated by rules or regulations promulgated 13 pursuant to the Administrative Procedure Act, shall be 14 automatically suspended for 60 days unless the Alabama Rules 15 of the Road provide a more serious penalty, and the time period that the licensee is subject to the restrictions of 16 17 subsection (c) shall be extended for six months from the date the person would otherwise be eligible to be designated as an 18 unrestricted driver's license holder or until age 18. 19

"(f) The license possessed by any resident of this state who is 17 years of age shall be deemed a Stage III unrestricted driver's license if the license has been issued for a period of six months or longer and the Department of Public Safety verifies that the license holder has not been convicted of a moving violation of the Alabama Rules of the Road within the preceding six months.

"(g) This section shall not apply to the following:

"(1) Any resident of this state age 16 years and
 over who is married or who is the head of a household.

3 "(2) Any resident who has otherwise been legally4 relieved of minority.

"(3) Any resident who is age 18 or over.

"(h) A person who drives a motor vehicle in 6 7 violation of the conditions imposed in subsection (c) shall be quilty of a traffic violation, but shall not be subject to any 8 criminal penalties or court costs. No citation shall be issued 9 10 for a traffic violation pursuant to this subsection unless the person is stopped by a law enforcement officer for a separate 11 12 violation of law and issued a citation or warrant for the 13 separate violation. Information concerning a violation 14 pursuant to this subsection shall not be released to any party 15 and shall not result in any points on a driver's license 16 record.

"(i) The Department of Public Safety may promulgate
reasonable rules and regulations to carry out and to aid in
enforcement of this section and Sections 32-6-7.3 and 32-6-8.

20 "(j) As used in this section, the following words21 shall have the following meanings:

"(1) STAGE I. A learner's permit.

"(2) STAGE II. A regular driver's license with
 restrictions based on age and the date of issuance.

"(3) STAGE III. An unrestricted driver's license."

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the
 first day of the third month following its passage and
 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
