1 Relating to municipalities; to add Section 2 11-43-42.1 to the Code of Alabama 1975, to authorize, in the 3 event of a vacancy in the office of mayor, the president of 4 the council to decline the office of mayor and remain on the 5 council; and to provide for the council to fill the vacancy in 6 the office of mayor when the president of the council declines 7 automatic succession.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

9 Section 1. Section 11-43-42.1 is added to the Code
10 of Alabama 1975, to read as follows:

§11-43-42.1.

12 (a) In any municipality governed by Section 11-43-42 13 in which the president of the council automatically succeeds 14 to the office of mayor in the event of a vacancy in the office of mayor, the president of the council may decline to succeed 15 16 to the office of the mayor and may remain as a member of the 17 council if the president of the council files a written declaration with the municipal clerk setting forth that 18 intention within 72 hours of the occurrence of the vacancy. 19

(b) In the event the president of the council declines to succeed to the office of mayor, the council shall fill the vacancy either from its own membership or from without the membership of the council, unless otherwise provided by law. The person elected by the council to fill the vacancy in the office of mayor shall be a qualified elector in the municipality and shall meet all other legal qualifications required by law for the performance of the duties of the
 office of mayor.

3 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the 4 first day of the third month following its passage and 5 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
