Section 1. Section 14-8-37 of the Code of Alabama 3 1975, is amended to read as follows:

"\$14-8-37.

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"The employer of an inmate involved in work release pursuant to this article shall send the inmate's wages directly to the county or its designated agent. Of each inmate's earnings, 25 percent of his the gross wages of an inmate as determined by the sheriff shall be applied to the costs incident to the inmate's confinement operation of the sheriff's office or other law enforcement purposes except that the funds may not be used to pay or supplement the salary of the sheriff or any person employed by the sheriff. If the cost of confinement of a state inmate as agreed upon in the maintenance contract authorized in Section 14-8-31 exceeds 25 percent of his the inmate's gross wages, the board Department of Corrections shall pay the difference to the county. The remainder of the inmate's wages shall be credited to his or her account with the county and shall be paid out as the inmate requests to furnish his clothing, medical and dental care, spending money, savings, or dependent support." Section 2. This act shall become effective

immediately following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
