1 establish the Alabama Equine Commission; to provide for the 2 members, duties, responsibilities, compensation, and expenses of the commission; to subject the commission to the Alabama 3 Sunset Law; and to provide that certain amounts deducted by a racing operator shall be used for horse activities in Alabama. 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA: 6 7 Section 1. (a) There is created the Alabama Committee on Horse Welfare. Membership of the committee shall 8 be as follows: 9 10 (1) One representative selected by each of the following organizations: 11 12 a. The Alabama Horse Council. 13 b. The Alabama Open Horseman Association. 14 c. The Alabama Hunter-Jumper Association. d. The Walking Horse Association of Alabama. 15 16 e. Racking Horse Breeders Association of America, 17 Inc., Alabama Branch. f. Alabama Saddlebred Horse Association. 18 g. National Barrel Horse Association, Alabama 19 20 Branch. h. Alabama Trail Riders Association. 21 22 i. Alabama Rodeo Association. 23 j. Alabama Arabian Horse Association. 24 k. Alabama High School Rodeo Association. 25 1. Alabama Appaloosa Association. 26 m. Alabama Quarter Horse Association.

- 1 (2) One member shall be appointed to the committee 2 by the Speaker of the House of Representatives.
- 3 (3) One member shall be appointed by the President 4 Pro Tempore of the Senate.

- (b) The membership of the committee shall be inclusive and shall reflect the racial, gender, geographic, urban/rural, and economic diversity of the state.
- 8 (c) The two legislative members shall co-chair the 9 committee.
  - (d) There shall be no more than three meetings of the committee which shall be held at the call of the chair. There shall be no compensation or reimbursement for any expenses relating to committee attendance by any member. Ten members of the committee shall constitute a quorum for the purpose of transacting business.
  - (e) The committee shall establish and report percentage amounts to be paid to the various horse-related activities and programs throughout the state from the funds provided by pari-mutuel pools for horse races. Horse-related activities include, but are not limited to, the following programs: rescue, adoption, retirement, education, special equestrian, therapeutic horsemanship, incentive funds, breeders fund, domicile inspection, building or construction, and any other equine events in this state.
  - (f) Once the committee completes the report reflecting the distribution of funds it shall provide the

report to the Alabama Equine Commission, whereupon the committee shall be dissolved.

- (g) The Alabama Equine Commission shall receive and distribute those funds for horse activities and programs in accordance with the report provided by this committee.
  - Section 2. (a) There is created the Alabama Equine Commission which shall be composed of the following members:
  - (1) A member of the Alabama Quarter Horse Breeders
    Association appointed by the board of directors of the
    association.
  - (2) A member of the House of Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives.
  - (3) A member of the Senate appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate.
  - (4) A member of the Alabama Thoroughbred Breeders and Racing Association appointed by the board of directors of the association.
  - (5) An individual who owns a horse for non-breeding and non-racing purposes appointed by the Governor.
  - (b)(1) The term for the members of the Legislature shall concur with the quadrennium appointed. The term of the other members shall be six years. A member shall serve until a successor is appointed.
  - (c) The membership of the commission shall be inclusive and reflect the racial, gender, geographic, urban/rural, and economic diversity of the state.

1 (2) If a member of the commission dies, resigns, or
2 leaves office for any reason, the Governor shall fill the
3 vacancy by appointment for the unexpired term.

- (d) The commission shall elect from its members a chair. Four members of the board shall constitute a quorum to transact the official business of the commission.
- (e) Each legislative member of the commission shall be entitled to his or her regular legislative compensation, per diem, and travel expenses for each day he or she attends a meeting of the commission, which shall be paid out of any funds appropriated for the use of the Legislature.
- (f) Nonlegislative members of the commission may be reimbursed for meetings by their respective organization according to the policies and procedures of the organization represented.
- (g) Meetings of the commission shall be held at the call of the chair or at intervals determined by the commission.
- (h) The commission shall administer the proceeds from the takeout.
- (i) The Alabama Equine Commission shall be subject to the Alabama Sunset Law, Chapter 20, Title 41, Code of Alabama 1975, as an enumerated agency as provided in Section 41-20-3, Code of Alabama 1975, and shall have a termination date of October 1, 2016, and every four years thereafter, unless continued pursuant to the Alabama Sunset Law.

- Section 3. (a) No later than the last day of each
  month racing operations shall transmit to the Alabama Equine
  Commission a percentage of the takeout deducted by racing
  operators as follows:
  - (1) An amount equal to seven percent of the total racing handle.

- 7 (2) An amount equal to 18 percent of the net of any 8 gaming or gambling at racing operations.
  - (3) An amount equal to 50 percent of any other gaming or gambling simulcast at a racing operation.
  - (b) All funds shall be used for horse activities in Alabama as follows:
  - (1) Seven percent of the total amount of the funds shall be used for horse activities and programs as determined by the Alabama Committee on Horse Welfare.
  - (2) Ten percent shall be used for the construction and expansion of horse facilities in this state as determined by the Alabama Equine Commission.
  - (3) Thirty-eight percent shall be used by the Alabama Quarter Horse Breeders Association for the breeders fund.
  - (4) Forty-five percent shall be used by the Alabama Thoroughbred Breeders Racing Association for the breeders fund and for the equine events for thoroughbred horses bred in Alabama.

Section 4. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
