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2 ENROLLED, An Act,

3 Relating to the salaries of public K-12 education employees; to provide for a revision of the State Minimum 4 5 Salary Schedule to reflect a pay increase of two percent beginning with the fiscal year 2013-2014; to provide that each 6 employee of certain boards of education shall receive the pay 7 8 increase according to placement on the appropriate salary 9 step; to require the appropriate increases on the State 10 Minimum Salary Schedule; to provide support employees with a 11 two percent pay increase beginning with the fiscal year 12 2013-2014; to require salary schedules; to provide the 13 employees of certain other public educational institutions and 14 schools with a two percent pay increase for the 2013-2014 15 fiscal year; to establish miscellaneous pay provisions 16 relating to public education; to require the Department of 17 Finance, in consultation with the State Department of 18 Education, to implement a program to purchase or provide a 19 policy of education employee liability insurance to insure certificated personnel and support personnel employed by a 20 local board of education and student teachers; and to 21 22 authorize the Department of Finance to implement and 23 administer the provisions of this act. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA: 24

Section 1. PAY INCREASES, FY 2013-2014. (a) The 1 State Budget Officer shall allocate to the State Board of 2 3 Education, the Board of Trustees of the Alabama Institute for Deaf and Blind, the Board of Youth Services School District, 4 5 the Board of Directors of the Alabama School of Fine Arts, and the Board of Trustees of the Alabama School of Mathematics and 6 Science and for disbursement to the employees thereof funds 7 8 based on the criteria established in this act. It is not the 9 intent of this act to make appropriations, but the 10 appropriations required by this act shall be made in the annual budget act for the public K-12 schools for the 11 designated fiscal year. 12

13 (1) Certificated Personnel (K-12). For the fiscal 14 year beginning October 1, 2013, and each year thereafter, each certificated employee at all city and county school systems 15 16 and the teachers at the Department of Youth Services School 17 District shall receive a two percent pay increase. Each step and cell on the State Minimum Salary Schedule contained in the 18 19 annual budget act for the public schools shall be increased by the amounts below for fiscal year 2013-2014, the State Minimum 20 21 Salary Schedule shall reflect the following percentage in-22 crease:

All certificated employees, including the Adult 10 11 Basic Education and Science in Motion employees, shall be 12 guaranteed pay increases in the amounts indicated above for 13 their years of experience and degrees earned and the 14 corresponding pay increases shall be reflected in the 15 appropriate local salary schedule and paid to each 16 certificated employee. The provisions and requirements of this act shall be in addition to the provisions of Section 17 18 16-13-231.1, Code of Alabama 1975, relating to the State 19 Minimum Salary Schedule. Each certificated employee shall be properly placed on the local salary schedule according to 20 21 degree earned and years of public education service (either 22 in-state or out-of-state), which shall be not less than the

amounts appropriated for the State Minimum Salary Schedule. 1 2 The employee shall be paid according to degree earned and 3 length of public education experience. The pay increase shall be given to each person employed for the 2013-2014 fiscal year 4 5 in addition to any state or local step increase to which the employee is otherwise entitled. The local board of education 6 7 shall transmit to the State Department of Education the 8 appropriate notice of the earned advanced degree for each 9 employee in a timely fashion; thereafter, the employee shall 10 be paid for the advanced degree as soon as the degree is certified to the State Department of Education as being 11 12 earned.

13 (2) Education Support Personnel (K-12). A two 14 percent pay increase, beginning with the fiscal year 15 2013-2014, shall be paid to each public education support 16 worker and adult bus driver, including Adult Basic Education 17 and Science in Motion personnel, employed for the 2013-2014 fiscal year in addition to the salary received during the 18 19 2012-2013 fiscal year, except employees covered under the 20 state's Merit System at the Department of Youth Services 21 District. Each governing body or authority shall establish and 22 maintain a salary schedule for each class and type of employee 23 and each step of each salary schedule shall be increased to 24 reflect a two percent pay increase beginning with fiscal year 25 2013-2014, which shall be given to the person employed

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full-time for the 2013-2014 fiscal year and each year employed full-time thereafter. The base rate of pay for part-time support employees shall be increased by two percent beginning with fiscal year 2013-2014. A separate local salary schedule shall be established and maintained for each specific job performed.

7 (3) AIDB. For the fiscal year 2013-2014, employees
8 at the Alabama Institute for Deaf and Blind shall receive a
9 pay increase which shall be in excess of their salaries
10 received during the 2012-2013 fiscal year. The increase shall
11 be as follows:

12 a. Certificated. The salary schedule for certifi-13 cated employees shall be revised to reflect at least the fol-14 lowing percentage increase beginning with the fiscal year 15 2013-2014:

b. Education Support Personnel (K-12). A two percent 4 5 pay increase, beginning with the 2013-2014 fiscal year, shall be given to each support worker employed full-time by the 6 Alabama Institute for Deaf and Blind. A separate local salary 7 schedule shall be established and maintained for each specific 8 9 job performed. The pay increase in this act shall be 10 incorporated into the support employees' salary schedules. The 11 base rate of pay for part-time support employees shall be 12 increased by two percent for the 2013-2014 fiscal year.

13 c. Miscellaneous Requirements. The AIDB board shall establish and maintain a salary schedule for each class and 14 15 type of employee and each step of each salary schedule for 16 fiscal year 2013-2014 shall be increased to reflect the pay 17 increase above to be given to each person employed for the 18 2013-2014 fiscal year and each year employed thereafter. The 19 pay increase contained in this subsection shall be paid to 20 each employee.

21 (4) Miscellaneous provisions. The following22 provisions are hereby established:

a. Fiscal Year. All salaries and salary increases
which are established by the State Board of Education shall be
paid in full to each person employed before the end of the
applicable fiscal year as defined in Section 16-1-1 of the
Code of Alabama 1975, as amended.

b. Extended Work. Public K-12 school employees on
contracts which extend beyond 187 days, or the hourly
equivalent thereof, shall be given a pro rata salary increment
for each or partial day of work extending beyond 187 days.

10 c. Local Increment. Any cost-of-living adjustment 11 and/or increase on the State Minimum Salary Schedule for teachers as provided in this act shall be exclusive of any 12 13 local pay increase granted or due to teachers under provisions 14 of any local salary schedule. Any cost-of-living adjustment 15 and/or pay increase required by this act for public school 16 support personnel shall be in addition to any pay increase due 17 or granted to the employee under provisions of any local 18 salary schedules. The pay increase provisions of this act 19 shall not apply to any salary supplements granted by local boards of education, bonuses earned for certification by the 20 National Board of Professional Teaching Standards, or the 21 22 federal portion of the salary paid to a Junior Reserve Officer 23 Training Corps (JROTC) instructor employed by a local school 24 board.

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d. Community Education. Each county and city board of education shall have the option to exclude from the provisions of this act any part-time employees of community education or school-sponsored child care or child enrichment program which is supplemental to the state-required educational program.

e. Local Chief Executive Officers. The pay increase
provisions of this act shall not apply to superintendents of
education of any school system or institution. Any pay
increase given to the superintendent shall be by majority
recorded vote of the governing body or authority.

12 Section 2. The pay increase granted in this act 13 shall begin in fiscal year 2013-2014 and continue in 14 subsequent years. Nothing in this act shall authorize 15 additional pay increases in subsequent years.

Section 3. For the purposes of this act, the following terms shall have the following meanings:

(1) CERTIFICATED PERSONNEL. Full-time teachers,
principals, and other education employees employed by a local
board of education and required to hold a certificate issued
by the State Superintendent of Education.

(2) LOCAL BOARD OF EDUCATION. A city or county board
of education, the Board of Trustees of the Alabama Institute
for Deaf and Blind, the Alabama Youth Services Board in its
capacity as the Board of Education for the Youth Services

School District, the Board of Directors of the Alabama School
 of Fine Arts, and the Board of Directors of the Alabama School
 of Mathematics and Science.

4 (3) STUDENT TEACHER. A college or university student
5 in an education degree program who, as part of the degree
6 program, is assigned to teach in a local public school
7 classroom, is providing instruction to students, and is being
8 mentored by a teacher.

9 (4) SUPPORT PERSONNEL or SUPPORT EMPLOYEE. Full-time 10 maids, custodians, adult bus drivers, lunchroom or cafeteria 11 workers, secretaries, clerks, clerical assistants, maintenance 12 workers, or other non-certificated employees.

13 Section 4. The Department of Finance, in 14 consultation with the State Department of Education, shall 15 establish a program of self-insurance or purchase or provide a 16 policy or policies of education employee liability insurance 17 from appropriations to the State Department of Education insuring certificated personnel and support personnel who are 18 19 employed by a local board of education and student teachers. 20 Such policy or policies shall protect against damages for 21 claims arising out of the performance of their duties or in 22 any way connected therewith. The amount of the insurance and 23 the appropriate coverage shall be in the discretion of the 24 Director of Finance. Appropriations by the Legislature to fund 25 the program shall be included in the annual Education Trust

Fund Appropriations Act. An insurance carrier providing any 1 2 portion of the education employee liability coverage under the 3 program shall be selected by a competitive process. Any amount of the appropriation for purchase of liability insurance 4 5 remaining after liability insurance is provided shall not revert to the Education Trust Fund, but shall be retained to 6 cover the costs of this program and is to be accounted for in 7 8 future appropriations.

9 Section 5. Insurance coverage provided by this act 10 shall automatically cover all full-time and part-time 11 certificated personnel and support personnel who are employed 12 by a local board of education, and student teachers who are 13 assigned to a classroom under the purview of a local board of 14 education, and shall be at no cost to the certificated 15 personnel, support personnel, or student teachers.

16 Section 6. The program of insurance established by 17 this act shall be administered by the Department of Finance. 18 The State Department of Education shall be the administrator 19 of this program for the school systems and in furtherance of 20 that duty shall pay the annual cost of the program to the 21 Department of Finance upon receipt of a statement of that 22 cost, and require the school systems to provide such 23 information as the Finance Director may specify to determine 24 the costs of the program and to adjust and defend claims.

1	Section 7. The administrators and all personnel of
2	the local school systems shall participate in the program in
3	accordance with the policies, procedures and rules established
4	by the Department of Finance.
5	Section 8. The program of insurance shall be
6	effective for insurance coverage of certificated personnel,
7	support personnel, and student teachers not later than July 1,
8	2013.
9	Section 9. The provisions of this act are severable.
