8 SYNOPSIS: Under existing law, the net proceeds of the  
9 revenue derived from the sale of National Guard  
10 license plates are distributed to the National  
11 Guard Historical Society. These funds are required  
12 to be used for society education programs and for  
13 the administration and preservation of museum  
14 artifacts of the Alabama National Guard Museum.

15 This bill would distribute the proceeds to  
16 the National Guard Foundation and the funds may be  
17 used in furtherance of the foundation's program and  
18 purposes.

20 A BILL  
21 TO BE ENTITLED  
22 AN ACT

24 To amend Section 32-6-111.2, Code of Alabama 1975,  
25 relating to National Guard license plates; to distribute the  
26 net proceeds from the sale of the license plates to the

1 National Guard Foundation; and to further provide for the use  
2 of the funds.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

4 Section 1. Section 32-6-111.2, Code of Alabama 1975,  
5 is amended to read as follows:

6 "§32-6-111.2.

7 "The net proceeds of the additional revenues derived  
8 from sales of the tags or plates provided pursuant to Section  
9 32-6-111.1, less administrative costs, including the cost of  
10 production of the plates, shall be distributed by the judge of  
11 probate or license commissioner to the state Comptroller. The  
12 state Comptroller shall distribute the proceeds to the  
13 National Guard ~~Historical Society~~ Foundation. The ~~society~~  
14 Foundation shall use these funds ~~for society education~~  
15 ~~programs and for the administration and the preservation of~~  
16 ~~museum artifacts of the Alabama National Guard Museum~~ in  
17 furtherance of its program and purposes."

18 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the  
19 first day of the third month following its passage and  
20 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
