| 15 | Section 1. Section 17-17-5, Code of Alabama 1975, is |
| 16 | amended to read as follows: |
| 17 | "§17-17-5. |
| 18 | "(a) <u>(1)</u> No <u>Subject to subdivision (2), no</u> person in |
| 19 | the employment of the State of Alabama, a county, a city, a |
| 20 | local school board, or any other governmental agency, whether |
| 21 | classified or unclassified, shall use any state, county, city, |
| 22 | local school board, or other governmental agency funds, |
| 23 | property, or time, for any political activities. |
| 24 | "(2) With respect to a person employed as a staff |
| 25 | member for a political caucus of the Legislature who is paid |
| 26 | from state funds, the term political activities does not |
| 27 | include work performed for the caucus related to the |

1 legislative process, including, but not limited to,

formulating and preparing policy for the caucus, preparing an 2 analysis of issues to be considered or under consideration by 3 the Legislature, or formulating a recommendation to the caucus 4 on issues before, or likely to come before, the caucus. As 5 used in this subdivision, "political caucus" means a caucus of 6 7 either house of the Legislature that represents the political party that is in the majority in the respective house or a 8 political party that is in the minority in either house. 9

10 "(b)(1) No person in the employment of the State of Alabama, a county, a city, a local school board, or any other 11 12 governmental agency may arrange by salary deduction or 13 otherwise for any payments to a political action committee or 14 arrange by salary deduction or otherwise for any payments for the dues of any person so employed to a membership 15 organization which uses any portion of the dues for political 16 17 activity. For purposes of this subsection only, political activity shall be limited to all of the following: 18

19 "a. Making contributions to or contracting with any 20 entity which engages in any form of political communication, 21 including communications which mention the name of a political 22 candidate.

23 "b. Engaging in or paying for public opinion24 polling.

25 "c. Engaging in or paying for any form of political 26 communication, including communications which mention the name 27 of a political candidate. "d. Engaging in or paying for any type of political
 advertising in any medium.

3 "e. Phone calling for any political purpose.
4 "f. Distributing political literature of any type.
5 "g. Providing any type of in-kind help or support to
6 or for a political candidate.

7 "(2) Any organization that requests the State of Alabama, a county, a city, a local school board, or any other 8 governmental agency to arrange by salary deduction or 9 10 otherwise for the collection of membership dues from persons employed by the State of Alabama, a county, a city, a local 11 12 school board, or any other governmental agency shall certify 13 to the appropriate governmental entity that none of the membership dues will be used for political activity. 14 15 Thereafter, at the conclusion of each calendar year, each organization that has arranged for the collection of its 16 17 membership dues from persons employed by the State of Alabama, a county, a city, a local school board, or any other 18 governmental agency shall provide the appropriate governmental 19 entity a detailed breakdown of the expenditure of the 20 21 membership dues of persons employed by the State of Alabama, a 22 county, a city, a local school board, or any other 23 governmental agency and collected by the governmental entity. 24 Any organization that fails to provide the required 25 certifications, that reports any expenditures for political 26 activity, or that files false information about political 27 activity in any of its reports shall be permanently barred

from arranging for the collection of its membership dues by any governmental entity. The Examiners of Public Accounts shall annually review a sample of at least 10 percent of the certifications filed with each governmental entity and report its findings to the appropriate governmental entity.

6 "(c) Any person who is in the employment of the 7 State of Alabama, a county, a city, a local school board, the State Board of Education or any other governmental agency, 8 9 shall be on approved leave to engage in political action or 10 the person shall be on personal time before or after work and on holidays. It shall be unlawful for any officer or employee 11 12 to solicit any type of political campaign contributions from 13 other employees who work for the officer or employee in a 14 subordinate capacity. It shall also be unlawful for any 15 officer or employee to coerce or attempt to coerce any subordinate employee to work in any capacity in any political 16 17 campaign or cause. Any person who violates this section shall be guilty of the crime of trading in public office and upon 18 conviction thereof, shall be fined or sentenced, or both, as 19 provided by Section 13A-10-63." 20

21 Section 2. This act shall become effective October 22 1, 2013, following its passage and approval by the Governor, 23 or its otherwise becoming law.
