23	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
24	Section 1. (a) The government official in control of
25	a public record or records shall within 10 business days
26	determine whether the public record or records requested are
27	subject to access pursuant to Section 36-12-40 of the Code of

Alabama 1975. Once a determination has been made, within 15
days the requester shall be notified whether the public record
or records are available for inspection and copying.

- (b) Any person, firm, corporation, or other entity that fails to receive the requested public record or records pursuant to subsection (a) within 30 business days may file an action in the Circuit Court of Montgomery County seeking an order to provide the public records.
- (c) In any action brought to enforce this act in which the court determines that either party acted without substantial justification either in not complying with this act or in instituting the litigation, the court, unless it finds that special circumstances exist, shall assess in favor of the complaining party reasonable attorney's fees and other litigation costs reasonably incurred. Whether the position of the complaining party was substantially justified shall be determined on the basis of the record as a whole which is made in the proceeding for which fees and other expenses are sought.
- (d) Any governmental official who provides access to information in good faith reliance on the requirements of this act shall not be liable in any action on account of having provided access to the information.

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
