26	Section 1. (a) That portion of a county sales tax
27	which is earmarked for indigent care by a county in this state

that has filed a petition for relief under Chapter 9 of the
Bankruptcy Code, pursuant to Section 301, whether prior to or
after the effective date of this act, and in respect of the
aforesaid petition there has been entered an Order for Relief
under Section 921(d) of the Bankruptcy Code shall be
reallocated as follows:

6 reallocated as follows:

- (1) Twenty-five percent to the county general fund.
- (2) Fifteen percent to fund programs for indigent families for housing, transportation, or food.
 - (3) Sixty percent for indigent health care.
 - (b) The reallocation of the proceeds from the sale tax as provided in subsection (a) shall terminate as of the earliest of any of the following:
 - (1) The date of entry of a final, unreviewable determination by a court of competent jurisdiction vacating the Order for Relief in favor of the county under Section 921(d) of the Bankruptcy Code.
 - (2) The date of entry of a final, unreviewable order pursuant to Section 930 of the Bankruptcy Code dismissing the county's Chapter 9 case.
 - (3) The date of entry of an order pursuant to Section 943 of the Bankruptcy Code confirming the county's plan for the adjustment of its debts.

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
