9	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
10	Section 1. Section 45-29-83.47, Code of Alabama
11	1975, is amended to read as follows:
12	"§ 45-29-83.47.
13	" (a) On and after April 18, 1986, a special
14	recording and indexing fee shall be paid to the county, and
15	collected by its judge of probate, with respect to each real
16	property instrument and each personal property instrument that
17	may be filed for record in the office of the judge of probate
18	and for the recording of other instruments and documents in
19	the probate office, in the discretion of the governing body of
20	the county, and on and after such date no such instrument
21	shall be received for record in the office of the judge of
22	probate unless the special recording and indexing fee is paid
23	thereon. The special recording and indexing fee shall be in
24	addition to all other fees, taxes, and other charges required
25	by law to be paid upon the filing for record of any real

1 property instrument or personal property instrument, and for 2 the record of any real property instrument or personal 3 property instrument, and for the recording of other instruments and documents in the probate office in the 4 5 discretion of the governing body of the county. There is hereby established a fee to be entitled special recording and 6 indexing fee which shall be set from time to time by the 7 8 Fayette County governing body to pay the cost of such improved 9 recording and indexing system. 10 "(a) A special recording and indexing fee of five 11 dollars (\$5) shall be paid to the county and collected by the judge of probate with respect to each: 12 13 "(1) Case filed in the probate court. "(2) Real property interest instrument, personal 14 15 property instrument, incorporation, notary bond, or name 16 change filed for record in the office of the judge of probate. 17 "(3) Marriage license issued by, or marriage 18 ceremony performed by, the judge of probate. 19 "(b) After the effective date of the act adding this 20 provision, no case may be filed in the probate court, no real property instrument, personal property instrument, 21 22 incorporation, notary bond, or name change may be filed for 23 record in the office of judge of probate, and no marriage license may be issued by or marriage ceremony performed by the 24 25 judge of probate unless the special recording and indexing fee

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1	is paid. The special recording and indexing fee is in addition
2	to all other fees, taxes, and other charges required to be
3	paid upon the filings and services covered by this section.
4	" (b)(1) On and after March 27, 1990, a special
5	recording and indexing fee of three dollars (\$3) shall be paid
6	to the county, and collected by its judge of probate, with
7	respect to each real property instrument and each personal
8	property instrument that may be filed for record in the office
9	of the judge of probate and, on and after such date, no such
10	real or personal property instrument shall be received for
11	record in the office of the judge of probate unless the
12	special recording and indexing fee is paid thereon. The
13	special recording and indexing fee shall be in addition to all
14	other fees, taxes, and other charges required by law to be
15	paid upon the filing for record of any real property
16	instrument or personal property instrument.
17	" <u>(c)</u> All such special recording and indexing fees so
18	collected <u>under this section</u> shall be deposited by the judge
19	of probate to <u>in</u> any bank in Fayette County and expended by

20 the judge of probate at his or her discretion for an improved 21 recording and indexing system and the purchase and maintenance 22 of such necessary equipment, the purchase or improvement of 23 other equipment, and facilities, and for personnel, and 24 operations of the probate office.

1	" (2)<u>(</u>d) The fees collected from this subsection
2	shall be subjected to audit by the Department of Examiners of
3	Public Accounts."
4	Section 2. This act shall become effective on the
5	first day of the third month following its passage and
6	approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
